CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL


1. All participants and volunteers shall comply with County Ordinance §8.40 governing special events.
2. A 20 foot wide traffic lane must be maintained at all times leading into the proposed camp area and continue through Left Hand Fork should a fire occur above the camp.
3. A 20 foot wide traffic lane through the middle of the proposed camping area shall be maintained for fire apparatus access.
4. Parking in Leatham Hollow must be arranged to allow fire apparatus within the parking area above Leatham Hollow.
5. An evacuation plan shall be in place and all staff shall be instructed regarding these procedures.
6. All fires shall be kept in metal container and be no less than six (6) inches above the ground.
7. Each camp shall be equipped with a fire extinguisher and water bucket
8. Burning pallets, trash, or other man-made materials is prohibited.


AGREEMENT OF ACCEPTANCE

Application Deadline: Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.




Parking

Leatham Hollow is set aside for long term parking. This area is large enough to accommodate vehicles with trailers, and is where those camping are required to park.

Handicap parking is designated near the main gate.

The area West of the main gate is designated as short term parking, where the general public will be asked to park.

Admission

During the course of the rendezvous, there will be permanent residents, as well as hours that we open the gate to the general public.

1. Normal hours open to the public will be from 08:00 to 18:00, and a walk in admission fee of \$2.00 per person, or \$10.00 for a family of five or more will be charged.
 - a. The general public has access to all areas of camp, where they can observe, or if they desire, participate in some of the events.
2. Those that choose to camp are expected to represent the time period of interest in both dress and the appearance of their camp. A fee per camp/business is required ranging from \$50.00 to \$60.00,
 - a. A prize donation is expected from each vendor, and club members family, which will be given to winners of the various events.

Proposed location, including a plat or map of the proposed area to be used, including any barricade, street route

The location uses a combination of land owned by Hyrum City Corporation, and the USDA, Forest Service. As of this writing, Hyrum city has granted the use of their land; The Forest Service is under negotiation but have not indicated any concerns. Attached is a satellite image of the area, which is located in the Left Hand Fork area of Blacksmith Fork canyon. As an attempt to help determine location and establish a point of reference, the main entrance into our event will cross the Left Hand Fork river onto Hyrum city property, at 41° 38'38.77 North, by 111° 42'19.93 West. This is the only authorized entrance into the event, and the only bridge that is capable of vehicular traffic.

Plans or perimeter/security fencing.

With the exception of a fence separating private property from the Forest Service land at the Southernmost area of camp, natural barriers within the valley define the area of our rendezvous. The mountains, road and river in this area run roughly North, North East. Steep mountains are on both the East and West sides of the event, discouraging foot traffic. What we refer to as "Primitive Camp" is located on the east side of the river. This is where the actual events will be conducted. On the West side of the river is the area set aside for modern camps, and vehicle parking. Barrier tape is strung in areas that identify camp boundaries as well as "hazardous areas (shooting ranges)"

Estimated numbers of event staff, participants and spectators.

Weather plays a big roll in participation by the general public. We can expect anywhere 100 to 500 transients entering camp daily. Permanent residents and campers, typically range 500 to 700 men, women and children.

x Public health plans, including plans for culinary water supplies, solid waste collections and disposal and waste

In compliance with Utah State health board requirements, OEMM does require all vendors to have a state issued business license, and adhere to all applicable food handling guidelines.

x Water (toilet facilities).

Twenty three standard, and at least one handicap accessible portable latrine will be placed throughout the camp. Our contract with the vendor requires sanitation and pumping at regular intervals. Hand sanitation will be included with each facility. Potable water will be available via a 500 gallon water trailer that will be filled as required from a city culinary source.

A roll off waste receptacle will be delivered, and serviced by the Cache County land fill. This receptacle, in conjunction with the requirement that campers remove their own solid waste, has historically been adequate to handle all of our needs.

Proof of insurance in conformance with County Ordinance 8.40.050(F).

x Fire prevention and emergency medical services plans.

Camp fires are required to be in a container, no less than 6 inches above the ground. 55 gallon metal barrels are provided for placement of ashes. Each camp will have a bucket of water or fire extinguisher nearby in the event a fire occurs.

As we have done for many years, the Cache County Search and Rescue will have representatives on hand 24 x 7 to help with emergency communications, and provide medical assistance. They will be located on the West side of the road, directly across from the main gate. Anyone needing assistance is welcome to contact the Search and Rescue. In conjunction with the Search and Rescue, OEMM has a number of members that are Utah State certified nurses and Emergency Medical Technicians who are ready to assist any time.

x Security plans and/or law enforcement response.

Security will be a combination of our traditional "Dog Soldiers" and deputies provided by the Cache County sheriff's office. Dog Soldiers are volunteers from within the camp that monitor safety and security of the camp. Two hour shifts of 2, two man teams from 20:00 to 06:00. Deputies from the Cache County Sherriff's office will be in and out of camp 24 x 7.

x Admission fee, donation, or other consideration to be charged or requested.

During the course of the rendezvous, there will be permanent residents, as well as hours that we open the gate to the general public. Normal hours open to the public will be from 08:00 to 18:00, and a walk in admission fee of \$2.00 per person, or \$10.00 for a family of five or more will be charged. The general public has access to all areas of camp, where they can observe, or if they desire, participate in some of the events. Those that choose to camp are expected to represent the time period of interest, in both dress and the appearance of their camp. A fee per camp/business is required ranging from \$50.00 to \$60.00, as well as a prize donation to be given to winners of the various events.

x Plans for Parking

Parking is separated into two distinct areas. A small area known as Leatham Hollow is set aside for long term parking. This area is large enough to accommodate vehicles with trailers, and is where those camping are expected to park. The area West of the main gate is designated as short term parking, where the general public will be asked to park. Handicap parking is designated near the main gate.

Further information may be required by staff, other departments and agencies, and/or the Board/Committee/Council that reviews the application based on the proposed event.

SPECIAL NOTE: OEMM has a long running history with both Hyrum City, and the US Forest Service, and are proud that we leave a CLEAN camp after the event. The Saturday following is traditionally designated as CLEAN UP day, where club member meet and canvas the area to assure there is no garbage left behind.
