CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. Applicant understands this will be the last Special Event Permit allowed for this year. The upcoming concerts on August 16th and September 1st will only be allowed if the conditions from the Conditional Use Permit have been met and it has been recorded.
- 2. All participants and volunteers must comply with County Ordinance §8.40 governing special events.
- 3. Event organizers must comply with the information as submitted in the Special Event application and the approved current conditional use permit.
- **4.** As necessary, event organizers, staff, participants, and spectators must allow access for emergency vehicles in the case of a wildland fire. Fire extinguishers must be readily available in the event of a fire.
- **5.** Due to the inherently higher life safety risks associated with special events involving gatherings of more than 1000 people the Cache County Fire District will also require:
 - a. **Fire Watch:** It is essential for public safety in a place of assembly or any other place where people congregate, because of the number of persons, or the nature of the performance, exhibition, display, contest or activity, the owner, agent or lessee shall provide one or more fire watch personal, as required and approved, to remain on duty during the times such places are open to the public, or when such activity is being conducted. [IFC 403.1]
 - b. **Public Safety Plan:** A public safety plan will need to be submitted to the Cache County Fire District a week prior to the event. Where the fire code official determines that an indoor or outdoor gathering of persons has an adverse impact on public safety through diminished access to buildings, structures, fire hydrants and fire apparatus access roads or where such gatherings adversely affect public safety services of any kind, the fire code official shall have the authority to order the development of, or prescribe a plan for, the provision of any approved level of public safety. 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- c. **Crowd Managers:** Trained crowd managers shall be provided for facilities or events where more than 1,000 persons congregate. The minimum number of crowd managers shall be established at a ratio of one crowd manager to every 250 persons. Where approved by the fire code official, the ratio of crowd mangers shall be permitted to be reduced where the facility is equipped throughout with an approved automatic sprinkler system or based upon the nature of the event.
- d. **Apparatus Standby:** As part of the public safety plan, the event organizer is required to have necessary fire apparatus on-site as determined by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ). Apparatus standby costs shall be reimbursed to the county at standard deployment rate as determined by Utah Forestry, Fire and State Lands rate agreement.
- e. **Parking:** A parking manager will need to be assigned to oversee effective parking procedures. Parking will only be allowed on green grass and dirt lots without any vegetation. Parking will only be allowed in the appropriate locations shown on the current conditional use permit. The parking manager must follow all Cache County parking restrictions.
- 6. Failure to meet any of the conditions of this permit, including parking outside of areas identified in the existing recorded conditional use permit, is a violation of this permit and the recorded conditional use permit. Violations of the conditions of the conditional use permit will be presented to the County Planning Commission to determine if the existing conditional use permit should be revoked.
- 7. A pre-event meeting was held with the Fire Marshall and the Sheriff's Department to discuss parking issues that need to be corrected. The following changes to the Cherry Peak Parking Plan will be implemented to fix the parking issues and if not followed, the upcoming concerts will not be allowed:
 - a. There will be six adult parking attendants that will receive payments for parking in the two lower hay field parking areas and will need to be directed on to the field to take payments on not on the county road;
 - b. There will be one adult parking counter at the lower hayfield parking areas;
 - c. Cherry Peak Resort will only sell 250 passes to park at the resort which is 150 short of capacity. There will be 350 cars allowed up to the resort including handicapped;
 - d. Mark off no parking area south of southwest light pole in the resort parking lot;
 - e. Mark off customer drop off area which needs to include no parking on the south edge at the resort;
 - f. Provide additional fuel for the light at the lower hay field parking area;
 - g. Block off ten stalls short of the switch back in resort upper parking area;
 - h. Employees must park in the posted employee parking area only;
 - i. Vendors must park in the vender parking area only;
 - j. There must be two adult parking managers, one for the lodge area and one for the lower hay field parking;
 - k. There will be five Sheriff Deputies for the concert.



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AGREEMENT OF ACCEPTANCE

As the applicant for the special event described above, I hereby agree to comply with all Federal, State, and County laws, ordinances, and regulations before, during and after the event. I understand that this permit is not transferable and agree not to transfer my permit to any person, corporation, organization or other entity and is only valid within the unincorporated county.

Application Deadline: Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.







As per the review with the Fire Marshall and The Sherriff's department the following changes to the Cherry Peak Parking plan are being implemented to fix the parking issues:

Six money takers in the two bottom parking areas. Parking payment in the field not on county road.

1 road counter at the bottom.

Selling only 250 passes for parking at the resort which is 150 short of capacity 350 will be allowed up the canyon including handicapped.

Mark off no parking area south of southwest light pole in parking lot.

Mark off customer drop off area. No parking on South Edge.

Provide additional fuel for light at bottom parking area.

Block off ten stalls short of switch back in upper parking.

Employees to park in employee parking

Hello Laurie,

I believe that there has been a slight misinterpretation of the Aggregate Limit. Please see the definition below:

Aggregate Limits

An aggregate limit is the most the insurer will pay during the policy period. Once an insurer is legally obligated to pay the full amount of the aggregate limit (either by judgment or settlement), the insurer has no further obligation to the policyholder during the remainder of the policy period for any subsequent claims or suits that are otherwise covered by the policy and that would be payable under that aggregate limit.

Exhaustion of an aggregate limit also extinguishes an insurer's duty to defend an insured against any subsequent suits that fall within the depleted aggregate limit.

A policy without an aggregate limit cannot be exhausted. The Occurrence limit is always available to pay claims during the policy period.
