- 1. All participants and volunteers must comply with County Ordinance §8.40 governing special events.
- 2. Event organizers must comply with the information as submitted in the Special Event application and the approved current conditional use permit.
- 3. Bear River Health Department requires all food vendors must be licensed and permitted.
- **4.** As necessary, event organizers, staff, participants, and spectators must allow access for emergency vehicles in case of a wildland fire. Fire extinguishers must be readily available in the event of a fire.
- **5.** Due to the inherently higher life safety risks associated with special events involving gatherings of more than 1000 people the Cache County Fire District will also require:
 - a. **Fire Watch**: It is essential for public safety in a place of assembly or any other place where people congregate, because of the number of persons, or the nature of the performance, exhibition, display, contest or activity, the owner, agent or lessee shall provide one or more fire watch personal, as required and approved, to remain on duty during the times such places are open to the public, or when such activity is being conducted. [IFC 403.1]
 - b. **Public Safety Plan**: A public safety plan will need to be submitted to the Cache County Fire District a week prior to the event. Where the fire code official determines that an indoor or outdoor gathering of persons has an adverse impact on public safety through diminished access to buildings, structures, fire hydrants and fire apparatus access roads or where such gatherings adversely affect public safety services of any kind, the fire code official shall have the authority to order the development of, or prescribe a plan for, the provision of any approved level of public safety. [IFC 403.2]
 - c. **Crowd Managers**: Trained crowd managers shall be provided for facilities or events where more than 1,000 persons congregate. The minimum number of crowd managers shall be established at a ratio of one crowd manager to every 250 persons. Where approved by the fire code official, the ratio of crowd mangers shall be permitted to be reduced where the facility is equipped throughout with an approved automatic sprinkler system or based upon the nature of the event.

[IFC 403.1]

Public Safety Plan: A public safety plan will need to be submitted to the Cache County Fire District a week prior to the event. Where the fire code official determines that an indoor or outdoor gathering of persons has an adverse impact on public safety through diminished access to buildings, structures, fire hydrants and fire apparatus access roads or where such gatherings adversely affect public safety services of any kind, the fire code official shall have the authority to order the development of, or prescribe a plan for, the provision of any approved level of public safety. [IFC 403.2]

Crowd Managers: Trained crowd managers shall be provided for facilities or events where more than 1,000 persons congregate. The minimum number of crowd managers shall be established at a ratio of one crowd manager to every 250 persons. Where approved by the fire code official, the ratio of crowd managers shall be permitted to be reduced where the facility is equipped throughout with an approved automatic sprinkler system or based upon the nature of the event.

Apparatus Standby: As part of the public safety plan, the event organizer is required to have necessary fire apparatus on-site as determined by the Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ). Apparatus standby costs shall be reimbursed to the county at standard deployment rate as determined by Utah Forestry, Fire and State Lands rate agreement.

Parking: A parking manager will need to be assigned to oversee effective parking procedures. Parking will only be allowed on green grass and dirt lots without any vegetation. Parking will only be allowed in the appropriate locations shown on the current conditional use permit. The parking manager must follow all Cache County parking restrictions.

Fireworks: Fireworks are not allowed per Authority Having Jurisdiction

Hi Laurie,

For what it's worth the City wishes to express some serious concerns related to Cherry Peak. We want them to be successful and provide an enjoyable experience for their patrons. However, safety should be Cherry Peak's number one concern.

Parking and traffic is a huge issue with these concerts. It is not the City's responsibility to be Cherry Peak's contingency plan for parking for either overflow or rain events. Also, the Cherry Peak staff has been taking it upon themselves to redirect traffic, close travel lanes, etc.. I know Mr. Chadwick called and wanted to utilize city parks and was told no. I did not give permission to park along city streets. These concerts are forcing the City to address the parking ordinances and the unfortunate part of that is that it will penalizes the citizens who live and park along there because Cherry Peak chooses to not have adequate parking. I understand there was rain that night, but that that does not become incumbent on the City to come up with parking. I really feel that there should be some way to make Cherry Peak show they have alternative parking in the event of rain or other weather related scenarios. I have attached some pictures so show the issues. I have spoken with my fire chief who has expressed concerns that if they are loading busses on the City streets how would an emergency vehicle get around them when there is only one lane of travel open. Also, does the Cherry Peak staff have the proper traffic control/flagger certification to be redirecting and stopping traffic? The City has been very patient concerning the traffic, we have tried to allow Cherry Peak time to come up with a reasonable plan to help minimize parking and traffic issues. It is time for Cherry Peak to address the parking.

Hi Laurie,

Thank you so much for your help with addressing this issue.

Regarding the email I sent on Monday, June 25, 2019. A meeting was held on Tuesday, June 26, 2019 between Mr. Chadwick (Cherry Peak Resort) and Mayor young. A parking plan was discussed and agreed to for Cherry Peak concert events. Cherry Peak has agreed to discourage parking randomly on Richmond City Streets. Richmond proposed to have a designated parking area for all future events that accommodates incidental weather-related issues. Cherry Peak has also agreed that they will not detour or stop the flow of traffic on Richmond City's streets. Cherry Peak also was given direction that residence will not be blocked or restricted by traffic flow or parking as to prevent access to their driveways.

It was agreed upon by both parties to have two options, one for good weather and a second for bad weather conditions. For good weather Cherry Peak has a current contract with private property owners to park all overflow vehicles for their events. Option 2, for bad weather conditions, cherry peak has agreed to have two additional parking locations designated for overflow parking. Richmond City has agreed to allowing some parking around certain Richmond facilities. In addition, Cherry Peak has an agreement with the property owner of Rocky Mountain Landscaping for overflow parking. Cherry Peak has also agreed to have parking tenants handle parking and work to reduce confusion and ensure parking is done in an organized manner. Richmond City reserves the right to adjust this agreement as needed and for different events.

Richmond City has a desire to work with Cherry Peak in a positive manner recognizing the benefits for both Cherry Peak and Richmond City.

I could not see as far as the Fire Code was concerned to deny the plan. However, I told him that it would have to be approved by the Richmond Mayor. I also told him that no matter where he parked cars that a 20 feet of unobstructed access would need to be maintained at all times and 50 foot turning radius is required for all corners. I confirmand with the Mayor of Richmond that he had met with Mr. Chadwick, he stated he had and was okay with the proposed parking plan.




