CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. All participants and volunteers shall comply with County Ordinance §8.40 governing special events.
- 2. Event organizers must comply with the information as submitted in the Special Event application.
- 3. Event organizers to recognize traffic safety and the requirement to yield to emergency vehicles.
- 4. This permit is valid only within unincorporated Cache County. Permits required by other entities or jurisdiction are responsibility of the applicant.
- 5. Full road closure of 600 South (Mendon Road) from during the hours of 7-9:30 a.m. is not allowed; however, a single lane closure will be allowed if the Cache County Sheriff's Office determines it is necessary during the race to protect the safety of the participants. The event organizers must provide licensed flaggers and/or Cache County Sheriff Deputies to control traffic during this portion of the event.

AGREEMENT OF ACCEPTANCE

As the applicant for the special event described above, I hereby agree to comply with all Federal, State, and County laws, ordinances, and regulations before, during and after the event. Last Friday, Sheriff Johnson and I rode the course and I think we have a good plan for the runners, support station and safety crews on the course. Our total number of marathon runners, the ones who will be going out to Mendon and back, will be no more than 300, and the 10K and 5K runners will primarily use the first couple miles of the start, the River Trail system, and Willow park area, which I have reviewed several times with Lt. Franke from Logan City Police. I also spoke to the Utah State Tax commission about the temporary sales tax forms - which she is sending me for any vendor who needs them at the downtown Logan expo.

Please advise if there are any more items you need from me. I'll check in with Logan as well to make sure we are good on the City permit, but I'm pretty sure we are. I just need to touch base with Craig Humphries today on the on-course support today, to get a contract in place.

Application Deadline: Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

A complete application must include the following unless specified otherwise: 1) Completed application form and application fee (\$75 – no refunds) submitted 45 days prior to event. Additional fees for services provided by the Sheriff's Office, emergency services, or others may apply. 2) Proposed location, including a plat or map of the proposed area to be used, including any barricade, street route plans or perimeter/security fencing. Total number of participants: Estimate must include event staff, participants, and spectators. 4) Public health plans, including plans for culinary water supplies, solid waste collections and disposal, and waste water (toilet facilities). Proof of insurance in conformance with the County Ordinance 8.40.050(F) minimums: \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 general aggregate, and \$100,000 property damage. Fire prevention and emergency medical services plans. 7) Security plans and/or law enforcement response. 8) Admission fee, donation, or other consideration to be charged or requested. 9) □ Plans for parking 10) \square If the event will be held on private property, a current taxation certification for that property. 11)
Further information may be required by staff, other departments and agencies, and/or the Board/Committee/Council that reviews the application based on the proposed event.

PROJECT REVIEW PROCESS

- The applicant is encouraged to meet with staff prior to the deadline date to discuss the project and ensure that the information submitted is sufficient to provide a complete review of the project.
- After the application is accepted, information packets are sent to various departments, agencies, and affected municipalities that provide comments and/or approval for the proposed event to the Director of Development Services.
- In some instances a pre-event meeting may be held with planning staff and representatives from the departments and agencies that provide comments on the project review. Any issues present on a project will be discussed with the appropriate department or agency.
- A draft permit is made available to the reviewing agencies, affected municipalities, staff, and the applicant.
- Following agency/department review and approval, and correction of any outstanding concerns/issues, the permit can be issued.



- Mostly flat course, simple out-and-back.
- Will not cross or enter a state highway (under at 1000 W)
- Run through un-populated, open roads and rural setting in the shade of the Wellsville mountains. Use of Logan Trail system, agricultural scenery, very little motor/car/truck traffic.
- Mendon City as the Relay Point and super support station.
- Support Stations at miles; 3, 5, 8, 11, 13.1, 17, 20, 22, 23.5, 24.5




Traffic Control: Cache County Sheriff to keep roads open, but controlled on Mendon Road = Course directional marshals = CC Sheriff Deputies.

2019 Fire Prevention and Medical Safety & Health Plan

The safety and medical/health plan for the Logan City Marathon consists of ten (10) types of public support. Most are also included on route map and traffic plan.

- 1. Sheriff's officers for Cache are alerted. Cache County will be on course in Valley. (For example Cache Sheriff's will be paid to have officers on course)
- 2. Ambulance alerted at Logan Regional Hospital (protocol for south Logan to Mendon is Logan Regional).
- 3. Emergency rooms and south-end clinic will be alerted at Logan Regional Hospital.
- 4. Radio/Cell Phone support by 20+ on course marshals and ride volunteers (amateur) and local HAM Radio club will provide on-course support with radio support to support stations and to Start/Finish line race director. (BARG)
- 5. On-course marshals and running 'Pacers'. As in prior events, 8-10 runner on course as rule enforcers and course marshals, running with participants to ensure safety practices and rule enforcement.
- 6. Experienced marathon volunteers. In easily identifiable (bright) shirts and traffic vests, positioned at corners and intersections where traffic signals need to observed. "Warning to slow down, obey traffic rules, be cautious, Water station ahead, ...". Also able to assist officers, volunteers and participants.
- 7. Private-hire Logan City Police. In uniform at start line locations and finish line locations. Logan City will control traffic at 100 W Center (Start & Finish).
- 8. A support van will be on the course and will make multiple loops on the course to provide rider support, and 'sweep' the course afterwards.
- 9. Portable bathroom stalls will be located at all support stations, start and finish lines. Also hand sanitizer and wet wipes.
- 10. All temporary structures will be non-flammable and temporary. All food vendors will be on-site businesses like The Creperie, Great Harvest and Stacked, no open flames of any kind will be used, no fuel on site except for amount used in the generator that powers the arch inflator. (Generator will be set outside on pavement).

In addition, 4ft X 2ft wood A-frame road-side warning signs will be strategically located to warn oncoming motorists and bikers that an event is in progress, and to guide runners throughout the course.
