- 1. All participants and volunteers shall comply with County Ordinance §8.40 governing special events.
- 2. Event organizers must comply with the information as submitted in the Special Event application.
- 3. Public safety will be handled by the Cache County Sherriff's Office as noted in the application for the portions of the cycling event located in unincorporated County. Applicant is responsible for coordinating with other public safety entities for portions of the event that occur within the jurisdiction of incorporated municipalities and UDOT/Utah Highway Patrol, as applicable.
- **4.** Event organizers, support vehicles, and riders must yield to and allow access for emergency vehicles as necessary.
- 5. Riders must adhere to all traffic laws and ride with a maximum of two riders abreast at any time.
- **6.** The event is scheduled during fire season. If a wildfire occurs during the event, the event may be subject to road closures and evacuations.
- 7. Applicant must coordinate with individual jurisdictions where the event crosses from unincorporated County into an incorporated municipality or another county and utilizes any facilities outside the county jurisdiction. This permit applies only to the unincorporated areas and/or facilities (i.e., roads) of the county.

Application Deadline: Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.

Application Checklist

A complete application must include the following unless specified otherwise:

- 1) 🖾 Completed application form and application fee (\$75 no refunds) submitted 45 days prior to event. Additional fees for services provided by the Sheriff's Office, emergency services, or others may apply.
- 2) Proposed location, including a plat or map of the proposed area to be used, including any barricade, street route plans or perimeter/security fencing.
- 3) Total number of participants: Estimate must include event staff, participants, and spectators.
- 4) Number Public health plans, including plans for culinary water supplies, solid waste collections and disposal, and waste water (toilet facilities).
- 5) A Proof of insurance in conformance with the County Ordinance 8.40.050(F) minimums: \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 general aggregate, and \$100,000 property damage.
- 6) In Fire prevention and emergency medical services plans.
- 7) Security plans and/or law enforcement response.
- 8) Admission fee, donation, or other consideration to be charged or requested.
- 9) | Plans for parking
- 10) \Box If the event will be held on private property, a current taxation certification for that property.
- 11)
 □ Further information may be required by staff, other departments and agencies, and/or the Board/Committee/Council that reviews the application based on the proposed event.

Project Review Process

- The applicant is encouraged to meet with staff prior to the deadline date to discuss the project and ensure that the information submitted is sufficient to provide a complete review of the project.
- After the application is accepted, information packets are sent to various departments, agencies, and affected municipalities that provide comments and/or approval for the proposed event to the Director of Development Services.
- In some instances a pre-event meeting may be held with planning staff and representatives from the departments and agencies that provide comments on the project review. Any issues present on a project will be discussed with the appropriate department or agency.
- A draft permit is made available to the reviewing agencies, affected municipalities, staff, and the applicant.
- Following agency/department review and approval, and correction of any outstanding concerns/issues, the permit can be issued.



2022 Cache Gran Fondo – Safety & Health Plan (Also includes Fire Prevention and Emergency details)

The safety and health plan for the Cache Gran Fondo ride/tour consists of eleven (11) types of public support. North Logan City Permit has been reviewed and tentatively approved.

- 1. Sheriff's officers for Cache and Box Elder alerted. Cache County Sheriff will be on course in Cache Valley. (Cache Sheriff's deputies will have motorcycle and car officers on course).
- 2. Ambulance alerted in Utah (Logan, Tremonton, Preston and Malad)
- 3. Emergency rooms will be alerted at Logan Regional, Brigham City, Malad and Bear River Valley Hospital. Life-Flight on alert.
- 4. Radio/Cell Phone support from on course marshals and ride volunteers (amateur) and local HAM Radio club Bridgerland Amateur Radio Club (BARC) will provide on-course support with radio support to support stations and to Start/Finish line race director. Many of the BARC members are also current and past EMTs and First Aid certified.
- 5. UDOT Road Respect Team members. As in prior events, 12+ riders on course bicycle marshals, riding with the riders to point out safe riding practices and rule enforcement.
- 6. Bicycle ride experienced volunteers. In easily identifiable shirts and neon vests positioned at corners and intersections where traffic signals need to observed. "Warning to slow down, obey traffic rules, be cautious, only 2 riders abreast, ...". Also able to assist officers, volunteers and participants. Safety cards handed to all riders at registration.
- 7. North Logan Police. In uniform at start line locations and finish line location during heaviest traffic periods. North Logan City will control traffic at 3000 North and US89 (start), unless UHP prefer.
- 8. Local bike shops and VeloFix will have roving bike technicians between support stations with support vehicles. (Al's Bikes, VeloFix, JoyRide Bikes). Cache Valley Amateur Radio club will also provide roving support between stations, and have technical/repair tools.
- 9. A Gran Fondo support vehicle will be on the course and will make multiple loops on the course to provide rider support, including sweeping signs and debris, collecting trash.
- 10. 34 Portable bathroom stalls will be located at all support stations, start and finish lines. Also hand sanitizer and wet wipes provided at all support stations.
- 11. No open flame will be used in any start, finish, or support station areas. No fire will be used to set up or maintain any items within the event. Food service will be self-contained food trucks or catering vendors. ALL food will be managed curb-side or in the establishment after the event.

In addition, 4ft X 2ft wood A-frame road-side warning signs will be strategically located to warn oncoming motorists and bikers that a bike tour is in progress, and to guide riders throughout the course.



- **Single Start and Finish line** (Eliminate the Logan Regional Hospital startline, set-up at Green Canyon, also eliminates Logan City for any portion of the event. North Logan has approved the plan to start and finish in North Logan). H
- **Screening** for symptomatic participants along with volunteers. ALL riders & volunteers temps taken, and documented having no symptoms, signed at packet pick-up. (Similar to how sports teams are managing small competitions and
- **Support Stations.** All are in small towns with operating grocery stores. Minimal open/prepared food items, liquid in individual bottles/cans, ice to keep items cold, Sealed water and Gatorade containers with long spigot (Like LOTOJA). m
- **Open-air outside Finish Festival**. Volunteers at Finish will supply wet towels, winner medals and Meal Vouchers. Rider asked to take meals quickly after they finish, but minimal mingling once awards and prizes are announced. 4
- **Food vendors.** All Food vendors would be local curb-side to-go preparation (or food truck) Vendors include: (Cafe Sabor, Elements, Great Harvest, Even Stevens, Lucky Slice Pizza, Swoll Bowl.). 'n
- **Prizes and awards.** Random winners selected in advance, & items distributed at packet pick-up or to local bike shops along the Wasatch Front, or sent directly to the winner's home. UCI and GFNS Awards given in Football Stadium where social distancing is allowed and encouraged. ဖ်
- **Limited spectators.** Family members can welcome riders and help them pick up medals and leave to pick-up meals. (with the staggered start times, and 4 different course distances, riders would be very well disbursed throughout the valley.) Volunteer at Finish to ensure riders/spectators not linger after meal pick-up and awards presented.
- **Rider Masks.** All riders will be asked to wear a mask when not on the bike, and masks will be made available before the event so if they chose to wear it, they could. o
- **Masks and Gloves.** All volunteers will wear masks and gloves. Also all volunteers will have had the vaccine (or be under 16), and be screened as above and sign a document certifying they have not been sick or have symptoms (6 questions). o.

START/FINISH Location










FINISH ALL DISTANCES: North Logan (GCHS)




ALL Distances: North Logan FINISH
