Hello,

My name is Jacqui Shelton and I'm now managing the Mass Gathering Permit. I reviewed the upcoming special events to determine if any have need for a Mass Gathering Permit and have determined that only the Little Red Riding Hood Bike Ride needs one, and they've already gone through the permitting process. The following are my notes for each event if you'd like more details.

Let me know if you have any questions.

May 14- Smithfield Health Days Fun Run- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. 450 people are reported to be in attendance (participants, volunteers, spectators, and staff). Mass Gathering permit is needed when 1000 people are in assembly for 2 or more hours in an area not designed for that occupancy or use.

May 21 - Cow-A-Bunga Race- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. About 100 people are expected to be in attendance (participants, volunteers, spectators, and staff).

June 4-16 Crossings Trail Run- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. 150 people are expected to be in attendance (participants, volunteers, spectators, and staff).

June 4- Little Red Riding Hood Bike Ride- Does need a Mass Gathering permit, and one was mailed out on 3/10/2022.

June 11- Ragnar Spring Wasatch Back- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. Spoke with Julia Bullard on the phone, given the way they are staggering the start a mass gathering permit won't be necessary (high end estimation of 300 people at the start at any given time).

June 18- Logan Peak Trail Run- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. 195 people are expected to be in attendance (participants, volunteers, spectators, and staff).

June 25- Bike MS- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. 985 people are expected to be in attendance (participants, volunteers, spectators, and staff).

July 9- Cache Valley Super Sprint Triathlon 17th Annual- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. Less than 250 people are expected to be in attendance (participants, volunteers, spectators, and staff).

September 17- Top of Utah Marathon- No Mass Gathering permit necessary. The event is anticipating 1000 participants, but they will not be in the same place for 2 or more hours as the races will be staggered.

Richmond is having their annual Black and White Days celebration.


One of the Cow-A-Bunga runs will be located partially on County Roads as is the longer Stampede Bike Races. (See attached)

Application Deadline: Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.

Richmond City's Black & White Day's Cow-a-bunga Race Saturday, May 21, 2022 7:30 a.m. Start Time

LOCATION: Three separate routes are available according to participants' desire. Maps are attached. The one mile and 5K runs are contained within Richmond City limits. The 10K route begins in Richmond at State & Main, runs north on State Street as it turns into 1200 East (County). The route turns East on 11800 North to 2000 East. At 2000 East there is a short jog to the North with a turn around to head back South, turning West at 11000 North which changes to Richmond City's 500 North. The runners will then proceed back to the start/finish line in Richmond.

PARTICIPANTS: It is estimated there will be about 100 participants including officials and families encouraging runner.

PUBLIC HEALTH: This is in coordination with Richmond's Black & White Days. There are adequate facilities for the group.




FIRE PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES: Fire and EMTs are on call for the entire B&W event.



FEE: Runners pay a fee of \$12.00 per person or \$40 for a family. This goes to help cover expenses. No profit is made.

PARKING: Adequate parking is available one block to the west of the starting line at the LDS Church parking lot.
