Application Deadline: Completed application forms must be submitted to the Cache County Development Services Office forty-five (45) calendar days before an event is scheduled to take place. This allows sufficient time for evaluation of the application. Late applications shall be denied unless the applicant demonstrates that compliance with the 45 day deadline was impractical or impossible due to the nature of the event. A special event permit application may be approved and a permit issued to the applicant by the Director upon approval by all the agencies specified in Section 8.40.40.

Authority: Cache County has no authority to approve permits for events other than in the unincorporated area of Cache County. Permits issued by Cache County apply only to the unincorporated area of the county, and if an event crosses into a municipality within Cache County or across the county line, applicants should determine if a permit is necessary in the other jurisdiction.

Right to Deny: Cache County reserves the right to deny permit applications for proposed special events which may pose, or have posed a significant danger or threat to the public health, welfare or safety, or which may result in unreasonable inconvenience or cost to the public. In the event the application is denied, the applicant may appeal to the Cache County Executive.

## Application Checklist

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*A complete application must include the following unless specified otherwise:*

- 1)  Completed application form and application fee (\$75 – no refunds) submitted 45 days prior to event. Additional fees for services provided by the Sheriff’s Office, emergency services, or others may apply.
- 2)  Proposed location, including a plat or map of the proposed area to be used, including any barricade, street route plans or perimeter/security fencing.
- 3)  Total number of participants: Estimate must include event staff, participants, and spectators.
- 4)  Public health plans, including plans for culinary water supplies, solid waste collections and disposal, and waste water (toilet facilities).
- 5)  Proof of insurance in conformance with the County Ordinance 8.40.050(F) minimums: \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 general aggregate, and \$100,000 property damage.
- 6)  Fire prevention and emergency medical services plans.
- 7)  Security plans and/or law enforcement response.
- 8)  Admission fee, donation, or other consideration to be charged or requested.
- 9)  Plans for parking
- 10)  *If* the event will be held on private property, a current taxation certification for that property.
- 11)  Further information may be required by staff, other departments and agencies, and/or the Board/Committee/Council that reviews the application based on the proposed event.

## Project Review Process

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- The applicant is encouraged to meet with staff prior to the deadline date to discuss the project and ensure that the information submitted is sufficient to provide a complete review of the project.
  - After the application is accepted, information packets are sent to various departments, agencies, and affected municipalities that provide comments and/or approval for the proposed event to the Director of Development Services.
  - In some instances a pre-event meeting may be held with planning staff and representatives from the departments and agencies that provide comments on the project review. Any issues present on a project will be discussed with the appropriate department or agency.
  - A draft permit is made available to the reviewing agencies, affected municipalities, staff, and the applicant.
  - Following agency/department review and approval, and correction of any outstanding concerns/issues, the permit can be issued.
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## Special Event Information-Ragnar Road Wasatch Back 2024

### Event Information

The Ragnar Relay is a 200-mile-long distance running relay race proposed to start in Logan on June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and end at Brighton Ski Resort June 8, 2024. Teams will conquer one of the most rewarding races in the Ragnar Series as they make their way through stunningly green mountains and postcard worthy countryside during their 200-mile adventure!

We anticipate 300 teams of 6-12 individuals in 2 vehicles per team (“Ultra” teams have six participants and one vehicle), therefore we expect less than 3,500 participants with 300 or less runners spread over 30-50 miles of course at any given time. Teams take turns running relay style to complete the course, picking up a runner and dropping off the next runner at each of the 36 exchange points along the course.

### Parking/Traffic Flow:

- Ragnar teams start in waves staggered from 5:00 am – 1:30 pm to spread participants along the course, allowing about an 8–10-hour time frame to pass through communities.
- Throughout most of the race, you can expect only 50-70 vehicles onsite. We anticipate less than
- Each team is responsible for providing two support vehicles, with six runners in each vehicle. The first vehicle will drop off the first runner at the start, and then proceed to the first exchange point. At the first exchange, the vehicle will drop off the second runner and pick up the first runner when that runner’s leg is complete. Teams will repeat this pattern for six legs until they hand off to their second vehicle. This leapfrogging pattern will continue all the way to the finish line.

### Race Personnel Onsite:

- Ragnar will have an exchange manager present during the entire race and 3-5 volunteers. Additionally, Ragnar staff will be present throughout the event to ensure everything is running smoothly.

### Sanitation and Garbage Disposal:

- Ragnar will provide portable toilets and manage all trash cleanup at exchanges.

### Safety, Emergencies, and First Aid

Runner safety is of foremost concern. Before a team can begin the race, they must go through a safety gear check and training. All runners sign waivers acknowledging that the course includes areas where there may be traffic congestion and that they must obey race rules, which require observance of all applicable traffic rules and regulations.

Runners and community residents can notify Ragnar through the Ragnar Race Command number, 661-RAGNAR-1 (661-724-6271) with any concerns of problems along the course. Medical personnel are provided at each Major Exchange point, or approximately every 25-35 miles of the course. If a runner encounters a first aid issue at a minor exchange, they are directed



to proceed to the closest major exchange to be treated. In the event of an emergency, runners are directed to contact 911 and then notify Ragnar staff.

## **Volunteers**

Exchanges are staffed by a combination of team required volunteers and community groups and charities. Groups and charities are given a donation for providing volunteers to manage exchange logistics such as parking, exchange chute details, team tracking and general runner directions. Volunteers are trained on site by a Ragnar staff member and released by a staff member once the last runner has come through.

Communities directly benefit economically from money spent by participants for food, lodging and other services. Additionally, Ragnar partners with regionally based charities and groups for each event to encompass an even more positive impact on the local communities.

These overnight relays benefit both participants and the communities where they are presented. Participants have been unfailingly enthusiastic about their experiences and there are always a wide variety of human-interest stories associated with these events. These range from the experienced runner finding special meaning through participation in a running event as a member of a team, to the first-time runner who participates at the urging of a friend and discovers previously unknown abilities and a love for running; to families, businesses, old friends and other groups who enhance their relationships as they individually and collectively test their limits; to teams who simply run for a cause, whether in honor of a deceased friend or relative, or to raise money for local charities or another charity of special importance to the team.



## Ragnar Road Wasatch Back in Cache County

- Teams will start at Utah State University between the hours of 5:00 am and 1:30 pm.
- Waves of 20 or less will take off every 15-30 minutes to run on road shoulders and sidewalks single file.
- 245 teams (245 individual runners) expected on course, spread out over 8-10 hours
- Road closure requested at the intersection on E Canyon Road and 800 East in Paradise for local traffic – Ragnar vehicles would still access southbound over Avon pass.
- Toilets at each exchange point provided and serviced by United Site Services
- Parking for participants at each exchange point. No public parking requested.
- Race director will work with police on additional traffic control requests and needs.
- Towns and exchange points pending approval.

### **Leg 1 notes (listed on app and website)**

Start line located in the parking lot of USU football stadium.

Ragnar will provide 1 water station on this leg. In an effort to be more sustainable these water stations will not have cups. Please carry a water bottle.

### **Leg 1 runner turn by turn directions**

0.0 Depart Start Line heading northeast through parking lot and onto 1400 N.

0.4 Right to run on the sidewalk with traffic on 1400 N. Road veers left and becomes 1500 N.

1.5 At rotary, take the second exit on Mountain View Ln. Continue straight when the road ends, follow foot path from road towards Bonneville Shoreline Trail.

1.7 Right on Bonneville Shoreline Trail.

2.7 At fork in trail, stay right to follow the main trail downhill past two water tanks on your right, crossing Canal Bridge, to the US-89 tunnel crossing.

3.0 Upon exiting tunnel under US-89 take a right to run on the road shoulder on Canyon road – you will cross Canyon Road when the sidewalk ends, and continue west against traffic

5.1 Left to run on the sidewalk against traffic on 400 East

5.6 Right to run on the sidewalk against traffic on 300 South

5.7 Left to cross 300 S and run on the sidewalk with traffic on 400 E/South County Road

6.0 Left to run on the sidewalk against traffic on 600 South

6.3 Right to cross 600 S and run on the sidewalk against traffic on 600 East

7.1 Right to run on the sidewalk against traffic on 100 North

7.4 Arrive at Exchange 1 – Spring Creek Middle School

### **Leg 1 support vehicle turn by turn directions**

0.0 Depart USU track/stadium parking left on 800 East

0.2 Right on 1000 North

0.5 Left on 600 East

1.2 Left onto Highway 89 towards Logan Canyon

2.9 Right onto Canyon Road and rejoin runner's path

Follow runner path from here to Exchange 1 – Spring Creek Middle School

- 8.2 Left to run on the sidewalk against traffic on 800 East
- 8.4 Arrive at Exchange 2 – Mountain Crest High School

### **Leg 3 notes (listed on app and website)**

This leg is run on sidewalks and road shoulders. Be mindful of traffic and love the locals by keeping noise to a minimum during nighttime hours.

Teams may support when safe and legal. Pull completely off the road and do not block traffic or driveways.

### **Leg 3 runner turn by turn directions**

Depart Mountain Crest High School running south toward E 300 South

- 0.1 Right to cross E 300 South with police assistance and run west on the sidewalk against traffic
- 1.0 Left to stay against traffic on S 200 East
- 1.4 Left to stay against traffic on E 600 South
- 1.6 Right to stay against traffic on S 600 West
- 2.7 Left to stay against traffic on W 7000 South
- 3.0 Right to stay against traffic on S 400 West
- 4.9 Left to stay against traffic on 8600 South
- 5.0 Right to stay against traffic on S 300 West
- 6.0 Left to stay against traffic on W 9300 South
- 6.6 Right to stay against traffic on S 100 East
- 7.1 Arrive at Exchange 3 – Paradise Park

### **Leg 4 notes (listed on app and website)**

There will be a Road Closed sign for local traffic at the intersection of E Canyon Road and S 800 East. This closure is for the race and Ragnar Vans are allowed through the closure.  
REMEMBER, ONLY VAN 1 IS ALLOWED OVER AVON PASS.

### **Leg 4 runner turn by turn directions**

Depart Paradise Park running south against traffic on 100 East

- 1.6 100 East veers left and becomes 1100 South
- 2.1 Right to stay against traffic on 800 E/ Canyon Road
- 3.9 Arrive at Exchange 4 – 800 East Field

### **Leg 5 notes (listed on app and website)**

This leg is run on a dirt road. Support vehicles should drive slow to avoid dusting runners. Exchange 5 is a choose your own exchange and runners can exchange anywhere between 7.4 – 8.4 miles into leg 5

## **Leg 5 runner turn by turn directions**

Depart Exchange 4 running south against traffic on 800 East – 800 East becomes Canyon Road 7.4 – Arrive at Choose Your Own Exchange 5. Exchange anywhere between 7.4 and 8.4 miles.

## Ragnar Wasatch Back Signage Plan


- Along the course there will be course signs that communicate to the runners which direction to go, on what side of the road to run, which exchange they are at, etc.
- Directional signs are only placed at change of direction intersections.
- Signs are 42” High, 18” Wide, .25” Thick and are made of corrugated plastic. Each sign will be secured to a delineator post barricade.




## Ragnar Wasatch Back Leg Maps




Leg 2: Spring Creek Middle School to Mountain Crest High School

to Paradise Park




Leg 4: Paradise
