

PETITION

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners in and for the said Cache County, State of Utah:

Your petitioners respectfully submit the following:

- of a major portion in area of the lands to be reclaimed or benefitted within the area proposed herein to be organized as a drainage
 district in the name of the Cache County Drainage District No. 4,
 in Cache County, State of Utah, which lands are susceptible of
 drainage, and your petitioners desire to provide for the
 drainage of the said lands included within the area as hereinafter bounded and described.
- (2) The lands which your petitioners desire to have included within the proposed drainage district are situated in the said County of Cache, State of Utah, and the boundaries of the proposed district are as follows:

Beginning at a point at the southeast corner of Sec. L., Tp. 13 N., R. 1 W. S.L.B.& M., thence west three miles to the southwest corner of Sec. 3, Tp. 13 N., R. 1 W., S.L.B.& M., thence north two miles to the northwest corner of Sec. 34, Tp. 14 N., R. 1 W., S.L.B.& M., thence exst two and one-half miles to the north q quarter corner of Sec. 36, Tp. 14 N., R. 1 W., S.L.B.& M., thence south one and one-half miles, thence east one-half mile, thence south one-half mile to the point of beginning.

inclosing an area of approximately 3360 acres; and a more particular description of the lands proposed to be included within the boundaries of the proposed drainage district is as follows:

Beginning at a point near the northeast corner of the southeast quarter of Sec. 1, Tp. 13 N., R. 1 W., S.L.B.& M., and extending in a generally westerly and north-westerly direction and terminating at a point near the northeast corner of Sec. 3, Tp. 13 N., R. 1 W., S.L.B.& M. together with the necessary interior drainage required to effect the efficient reclamation of the lands within the district boundaries.

- (4) Your petitioners herewith submit a true copy of the equalized county assessment roll for the year 1920 being the roll next preceding the presentation of this petition for the organization of the said drainage district, as shown by the records and assessment roll in the office of the county assessor of Cache County, State of Utah, as evidence of the ownership and title to the said described lands, which said copy of said assessment roll is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and made a part of this petition.
- (5) Your petitioners herewith append an affidavit giving a list of non-residents who own land within the boundaries of the proposed district together with their places of residence when known, and where

not known, stating the fact and that upon diligent inquiry they could not be ascertained, which said affidavit is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit B" and made a part of this petition.

Wherefore, your petitioners respectfully pray as follows:

- (1) That pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 95 of the Session Laws of Utah, 1913, and amendments thereto, the land above described and bounded be organized into a drainage district to be known as __Cache _____ County Drainage District No. _4 ___, in the County of _____ Cache _____, State of Utah; that said lands may be drained and reclaimed and protected.
- (2) That your honorable body fix a time and place for a hearing on this petition, and that due and legal notice of the time and place
 of the hearing upon said petition and the purpose for which the petition will be heard, be given as required by law, to all parties interested.

Your petitioners further pray that the said petition be granted; that the proposed drainage district be organized as a body corporate and that three drainage supervisors be appointed as provided by statute.


A Committee composed of J. E. Robson, A. J. Harper and Joseph Petersen presented a written petition on behalf of J. L. Payne and 49 others being the owners of title of a major portion in area of the lands to be reclaimed or benefitted within the area of a proposed Drainage District to be known as Cache County Drainage District No. 4. On motion of Commissioner Hyer, seconded by Commissioner Murray it was ordered that the petition as presented by the committee be accepted and filed by the clerk. Thereupon Commissioner Murray moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Whereas, J. E. Robson, and others have this day filed with the County Commissioners a Petition in due form by the owners of title of a major portion in area of the lands to be reclaimed or benefitted or which are susceptible of drainage in the proposed Drainage District and praying for the organization of a Drainage District to be known as Cache County Drainage District No. 4 which petition contains a general description of the proposed work and sets forth a particular description of the proposed boundaries of such District, together with a list of the land owners and the amount of land owned by each and their place of residence, together with an Undertaking in the sum of \$1680.00 being 2% of the estimated cost of the proposed improvements in the said Drainage District in the manner and form required by law.

CENERAL STATEMENT.

Cache County Drainage District No.4 lies in the western part of the Cache Valley in Cache County, Uthh. The district includes most of the town of Trenton and its northern boundary is contiguous to Drainage District No.1,--Cornish. The Trenton district proclaimed by the County Commissioners on July 11,1921, comprises an area of about thirty one hundred eighty acres. This area, two miles long north and south by two miles wide east and west, lies on a bench some fifty feet above the Bear River bottoms. It is bounded on the north by the Ransom slough, on the west by the West Cach Canal, which runs along the foot hills; on the east by the edge of the bench above Bear River and on the south by the south lines of sections 1, 2, 3, Township 13 north, Range one west.

Springs both above and below the Mest Cache canal give evidence of some underflow from the hills to the west, and in addition there is a greater supply from the canal itself. Except for these factors the district, as will be evident from the description above, is a natural drainage district.

The lands of the district are of two general types.

The western portion lying along and at the foot of the slope is generally a clay soil, which tends Xin places to be heavy and impervious. Along the eastern side, the soils are of a sandy nature. The clay soils are being farmed wherever the ground-water and alkali conditions will permit. The sandy soils

SURVEYS AND INVESTIGATIONS.

The first requirement for an intelligent study of a drainage problem is an accurate topographic map such as has been made of this district. In its preparation the horizontal control was established by transit and tied to section corners where practicable and otherwise to steel pins set 4 ft. in the ground at frequent intervals over the entire district. The verical control was made by Y level and bench marks permanently established at all conspicuous points in the district with reference to U. S. G. S. see level datum. It is therefore possible to fix any point either on the map, or on the ground and determine both its horizontal and vertical position with reference to any other point in the district.

It is made to a scale of 400 ft. to one inch with contour interval of one foot, except where the slopes are more pronounced. In addition to contours the map shows the names of owners of all lands in the district taken from Count, Records for use in the identification of lands and making up assessment rolls. It also shows physical features such as roads, canels, houses, fences, railroads etc., all of which are shown with reference to section, township and range.

The second requirement and absolute essential for a thorough sutdy and ultimate design of a drainage system is an exhaustive investigation of sub-surface conditions, both with reference to the soil and to the ground water.

put down on your district and cased with 1 inch perforated wrought iron pipes.

They average about 1/4 mile apart over the entire district.

The location, number and elevation of each well is given on the accompanying map. These wells were bored with a 1½ inch auger to a depth of 15 ft. except where running sand made such depth impossible. A log of the soil, also the distance to ground water was carefully observed and recorded for each well, which record together with two ground water observations made since is attached to and made a part of this report.

tend to the belief that the water table began to rise about
Nov.lst and according to the best information from persons who
have observed domestic wells it will continue to do so until
about April, at which time it will be doubtful indeed if the
distance to ground water at any point within the district will
exceed 3 ft. and indeed on possibly half of the district it
will be on the surface. The need therefore for drainage can
not reasonably be disputed.

The results of this sub-surface investigation have been plotted for study in two ways:

First: The ground water contours from the well readings for October were plotted on the topographic map. From
these contours the direction and some indication of the varying
intensity of flow can be determined.

The same contours taken in conjunction with the ground surface contours permit a very close determination of the depth to ground water at all points in the district. From this study it appears that the ground water stands from 0-2 ft. below the surface on about 600 acres lying along the 0. S. L. railroad and the big slough running diagonally across the district. This area is waste or salt grass pasture land. About 1300 acres distributed generally over the district has a water table 2-4 ft. below the surface. On most of this area crop production is seriously decreased by alkali and ground water. Scattered over the district are 700 acres having a water table 4-6 below the surface and 600 acres having the ground water more than six feet from the surface. This area is still producing well.

Second: A further study of the relation of the ground water to the sub-soil and surface conditions was made by plotting sections north and south across the district at each quarter mile on the flat area. Along the west side of the district sections were plotted east and west running from the West Cache canal well out on to the flat land at each quarter mile.

It appears from this study that, that part of the district about 1/4 mile in width lying contiguous to the West Cache canal and embracing about 400 acres is for the most part clay loam and that the balance of the district is a sandy loam. The boundary line between the clay and sandy sub-soils has been shown on the map. It is also evident from this study that there is a large inflow of water along the most west boundaries of the district made up, undoubtedly, of underflow from the hills

and seepage from the canal. This underground water has destroyed the crop producing power of a large part of the land in the district and threatens to destroy that of most of the remaining area. Both methods of plotting show that in general the surface of the underlying water follows the ground surface.

The character and amount of the alkali salts contained in the soil and ground water are important factors in the drainage problem. In this district representative samples of the ground water were taken and analyzed by Dr. J. E. Greaves. Chemist and Soil Bacteriologist at the Utah Agricultural College. Several series of soil and sub-soil samples, representative of the various types of soil, were taken by Dr. D. S. Jennings. Associate Professor of Soils, also of the Agricultural College.

The results of the tests by Dr. Greaves show that.

where the total of the alkali salts in the ground water is very large, by for the larger part of it is sodium chloride or common salt. The balance is chiefly made up of a smaller amount of the carbonates of calcium, magnesium and sodium. The analyses of the soil samples are now being made but have not yet been reported.

However, both ground water and soil samples were taken in both the Lewiston and Cornish districts which are fairly representative of the various conditions in this district. The analyses of these samples show that the alkali accumulations on even the sandy lands are becoming serious enough to interfere with plant growth. On the badly alkalied areas the concentrations are sufficient to entirely prevent the growth of valuable plants but not such as will prevent uttimate complete reclamation.

The investigation and study of the district herein set forth demonstrates that the reclamation of these lands is imperative if those which are now producing are to be kept from destruction by alkali and ground water and if the now waste lands are to be restored. It is our opinion that such reclamation is entirely feasable.

We have prepared in conjunction with your Attorney and attach herewith a description of each and every tract of land in your district, together with the name of the respective owners all according to the records of the County Recorder. Some of the names may be in error due to erronous deed descriptions, unrecorded deeds or transfers. These, however, can be changed where discovered.

DRAINAGE AS THE MEARS OF RECLAMATION.

A high water table such as these investigations disclose damages the farm in two principal ways.

The first type of damage is due to the saturation of the soil with water. The growth of plants and especially of those which are of economic importance is dependent on a soil which has a large volume of pore space filled partially with air and partially with moisture. The roots of none of the ordinary farm crops raised in the mountain region will survive in a soil which is saturated with water. Moreover the elemental plant food in the soil must be broken up by soil bacteria before it is available for use by crops. These bacteria cannot live without both air and moisture in the soil pores. The normal feeding zone of plant roots where conditions are proper extends to a depth of several feet. If this zone is restricted by a high water table

the available plant food is diminshed and as a result the growth of crops is impaired. For these reasons profitable farming can not be carried on where the ground water is very close to the surface.

The second manner in which a high water table interfers with crop production is by the presence or accumulation of alkali.

In all soils water is raised by capillary action from the ground water. This action is the same as that which occurs when the wick in a lamp raises the oil to the flame. The amount of water and the height to which it will be raised depends on the character of the soil. In general the coarser soils such as sandy loams and sands will raise more water but to a less height than the finer ones such as silts and clays. In this district the sandy soils will probably raise large quantities of water to a height of four feet while the clay soils will bring smaller quantities up six or more feet.

Water brought to the surface by capillary action brings with it whatever alkali salts it may contain. Where this water is evaporated from the surface, since only pure water is carried off in this way, the alkali salts remain in the soil. As this action continues there is an accumulation of the alkali at or near the surface even where the ground water itself contains only moderate amounts of these salts. If the ground water remains close enough to the surface for this action to take place over a long period of time the alkali becomes so strong that it prevents the growth of crops.

Although it is possible to keep the alkali from reaching this concentration where the water is from three to four feet from the surface it requires constant effort and expense in leaching and in consequence valuable plant food is carried off. Therefore, if farming operations are to be carried on economically, the ground water must be lowered to such a depth, in this district not less than six feet, that the capillary action can not bring up alkali.

Drainage, if it is really successful, accomplishes this lowering of the water table. To secure a depth to ground water of six or more feet, it is necessary to have drains not less than eight feet deep and better results will be attained by ten foot depths. The drains must be several feet deeper than the depth to water required on the land because there is, and always must be, a drop from the level of the ground water to the level of the water in the drain. This drop or fall is required to force the water to flow and will be very steep close to the drain and much flatter back at some distance. In fact it will nearly always be found that the ground water within a short distance, say fifty feet, will be one, two or more feet above the water in the tile or open ditch as the case may be, except for the most porous sands and gravels.

The fact that the underground waters of the district are charged with alkali is attested by the serious accumulations of these harmful salts in the surface soil wherever the ground water has stood for a long time close to the surface.

PROPOSED DRAINAGE SYSTEM.

The drains proposed to be constructed are divided into two classes, primary and secondary. The primary system includes: Drain No. 1 an open ditch except for the upper

1/4 mile emptying into Bear river and running up the slough from the southeast to the northwest corners of the district: Drain No. 2, an open ditch except for the upper 1/2 mile emptying into the Ransom slough at the north end of the district and running south the entire length of the district on the west side of the railroad: Drains No's. 3 & 4 having their outlets in No. 2 and No. 4A having its outlet in No. 4. all closed tile except the lower 900 ft. of No. 4 and all running along the slope below the West Cache Canal: Drain No. 5. a closed tile line, emptying into a natural watercourse at the southern boundary of the district and running along the upper edge of the wet area in that part of the district. There are a total of 4.5 miles of open ditch and 2.5 miles of closed tile drains in the primary system. The secondary system includes: Drain No. 6, a closed tile line, emptying into No. 5 and running along the slope in an easterly direction: Drains No's. 7 & 7A, open ditches in the depression near the northern boundary of the district: Drain No. 8, an open ditch in the depression in the northwestern part of the district: Drain No. 9, an open ditch having its outlet in a natural watercourse at the southern boundary of the district and running north on the east side of the railroad: Drain No. 10, a short open ditch running north from an outlet in No. 9: Drain No. 11. a closed tile line in the northwest corner of the district having its outlet in No. 2. There are a total of 3.8 miles of open ditch and 1.2 miles of closed drain in the secondary system. Both systems are shown on the map.

In planning the drains a study was made of the possibility of constructing at a reasonable cost and of maintaining tile drains. It was found, however, that only very flat slopes were obtainable and also that the surface water at the time of the spring run-off was a cause of serious trouble and should be taken care of. This surface water comes in large volume and on account of the silt and rubbish it carries is not easily taken care of in closed drains with flat slopes. Further the material at the depth at which it was proposed to lay the tile is a fine sand in which it is very difficult to lay and maintain tile. For these reasons it was proposed to use open ditches where these conditions exist. So far as possible such open ditches will be constructed along property lines so as to minimize the damage to farm lands.

The use of open ditches for deep drains is not in any way an experiment or departure from the best methods. The United States Reclamation Service which has probably completed more drainage than any other organization in America, if not in the world, has completed more than fifteen hundred miles of deep open drains. These have been so successful that they are still using five times as many open drains as closed tile lines.

A careful study of all the data gathered as outlined above and of conditions on the ground shows that it is necessary to cut off or intercept the flow of water from the West Cache Canal and the hills as soon as possible after it enters the district. For this purpose drains No's. 2, 3, 4, and 4A are located along the slope just below the canal.

It is also necessary to lower the water table under the flat lands of the district. Fortunately there is a slough running diagonally across the district which is already several feet below the general ground level. By excavating a ten foot drain in the bottom of this slough an effective depth of much more than ten feet as compared with the general level is obtained.

It is believed that the primary system in conjunction with the natural underdrainage will so lower the water table under the whole district as to preclude the necessity of any further construction. However since there is a posibility that this result will not be attained the secondary system has been planned.

It is proposed to construct the primary system first and watch the effect on the ground water. If it is found that the secondary drains are still needed they will then be constructed.

COST

A careful estimate of the cost of constructing the proposed works has been made. Profiles of the ground surface along all drains were plotted and the best available grades for the type of drain marked thereon. The required capacity and from that the necessary size of the lines was determined. The open ditches would need to be four and six feet wide on the bottom in order to be large enough to carry all the water which it is computed will reach them. However it is impossible to dig ditches as narrow as that in many sandy soils. In such soils the narrowest bottom width which can be successfully constructed is about eight feet. Since it is probable that this will be true of

most of the drains in this district the quantity of earth to be moved has been computed on the basis of an eight foot bottom width. Side slopes of the open ditches of one and one half horizontal to one vertical are necessary to avoid caving and sloughing of banks. From the profiles estimates of the yardage of earth to be moved in open ditch excavation and of the length of the various depths of trench for closed drains were made. The number of structures such as highway crossings, farm crossings, tile outlets and etc. were counted.

Unit prices for the various classes of work were determined from a study of the cost of doing similar work on many other
projects. These costs covered a number of contract bids recently made on similar work and summaries of the cost of such work,
notably by the U.S. Reclamation Service.

The unit prices when applied to the quantities determined as above outlined give the cost of construction. To this cost was added an estimate of the cost of organization, legal, engineering and incidental expenses, a percentage to cover a probable discount on the bonds and a further percentage to cover contingencies.

or \$40.00 per acre for the primary system alone and \$175,000.00 or \$56.00 per acre for both the primary and secondary systems.

MAINTENANCE

The most complete records of the cost of maintaining drainage systems are those of the United States Reclamation Service. These records show that the average annual cost of maintaining open drains is approximately \$80.00 per mile; for closed drains the cost will run about \$10.00 or \$15.00 per mile

per year less. These costs include patrolling the lines, cleaning out weeds and other rubbish, etc. The drainage system proposed for this district includes a total of twelve miles of drain.
At \$75.00 per mile the total annual cost of maintaining the system
will be \$900.00.

DAMAGES

causes some damage to the lands over which the drains are constructed. In the case of closed tile drains the only damage is the temporaty inconvenience caused by the work of construction and the possible loss of one season's crop on the ground term up in constructing the drain. Since in this district the tile lines as proposed almost all run through land which is not now productive, there will be no material damage caused by their construction.

An open ditch, on the other hand, permanently occupies the land taken by the ditch and its accompanying spoil banks. Ditches of the size proposed for this district will take a strip of land almost one hundred feet in width. The area of land so taken has been determined and its value computed. The value of the lands now waste or only slightly productive was taken at \$\int 100.00 per acre. of those lands still highly productive as \$\int 500.00 per acre. The damage Aone and the unsightly appearance of open drains may be very materially reduced by partial or complete leveling of the spoil banks. Partial leveling may be expeditiously and cheaply accomplished by means of the excavating machine used for constructing the drains.

The total area of land taken for right of way in this district will be 99 acres valued at \$15,760.00.

BENEFITS

The benefits which will accrue to the lands in the district by reason of the construction of the drainage system are of several kinds.

FIRST. Lands which are so completely water-logged as to prevent their being cultivated will be dried out so as to permit the usual farm operations.

SECOND. Lands which are so covered with alkali salts that little or no crops can be raised will have the water table so lowered that it will be possible to leach out the alkali salts and after that will be susceptible of farming by ordinary methods.

THIRD. Lands which are only slightly damaged by alkali accumulations or are in imminent danger of becoming so damaged will be saved from further injury by alkali and will therefore be kept in a condition for profitable crop production.

FOURTH. Lands which by reason of a high water table or adverse topographic conditions are wet so late in the spring as to prevent their cultivation and the planting of crops at the proper time will be rendered as early as the most favorably situated lands in the district.

It is believed that these benefits, while of somewhat different natures, are substantially of the same value to all the lands in the district and will exceed \$100.00 per acre. Therefore the total benefits, which will accrue to agricultural lands from the construction of the drainage system will exceed \$310,000.00.

BOND ISSUE

The best method of financing the construction of the drainage system is by the issue of bonds as provided in the drainage district law. It is recommended that sufficient bonds be authorized to construct the entire system. Only enough will be sold at first to complete the primary system. If the secondary system is not then needed no further bonds need be sold.

There follows the data required for your report to the County Commissioners as provided in Section 2053, Title 26, compiled Laws of Stah, 1917, as amended by 1919 and 1921 Session Laws.

(a) The drainage system proposed in the petition for the organization of the district is proper and feasible with the exception that the main drain should commence in the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 1, Township 13 North of Range 1 West.

DESCRIPTION OF DRAINS.

Mo. 1. An open ditch having its outlet in Bear River in the south-west quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 1. - (b) The probable aggregate cost of the construction of works herein set forth, including all incidental expenses and the cost of organization, will be for the primary system alone \$125,000.00 and for both primary and secondary systems \$175,000.00.
- (c) The probable annual cost of keeping the system in repair will be \$900.00. This estimate of the annual cost of maintenance is based on the assumption that it will be necessary to construct both the primary and secondary systems.
- (d) The damage which will be done to the lands in the district will be the taking of a strip of land one hundred feet wide as a right of way for the open ditches. The aggregate amount of the damage caused by the construction of both primary and secondary systems will be \$15.760.00.

The total value of the benefits to the lands in the district will exceed \$310,000.00.



These lands will be drained by the system described herein and should therefore be included and assessed on the same basis as other lands in the district.

All that part of the southeast quarter of Section 28. Township 14 North of Range 1 West lying below or to the east of the West Cache Canal will be benefited by the construction of the system herein described in as much as outlets will be provided for the complete drainage of this tract. To secure the complete drainage of this tract further drains should be constructed. It is recommended that these drains be constructed and that this tract be made a part of the district. This recommendation is made because the proper drainage of the tract in question can be accomplished in the best and cheapest manner in conjunction with the drainage of the rest of the district. Moreover the failure to include this tract will mean that it probably never can be drained at a reasonable cost. Also its location is such that its undrained condition will be detrimental not only to the Trenton district but to the Cornish district and the town of Trenton.

The advantage to be derived from drainage is the benefit to the land itself rather than to the owner. This is the
correct view and aust always be taken in determining the feasibility of any public improvement if progress is to be made.
The financial standing of the owners of the poorest land which
may be most in need of improvement is very often, if not generally, the poorest of any in the district. This makes it all the
more important that such lands be improved in order that both
the land and its owners may become self-sustaining and able to
bear their proper share of the barden.

SUPERVISORS REPORT

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Cache County, Utah:

Comes now the Board of Supervisors of the Cache County
Drainage District Number Four and hereby makes and files with the
Board of County Commissioners of Cache County, Utah, its findings
and report, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2053 and 2054,
Chapter 41, Session Laws of Utah, 1919, as amended by Chapter 47
of the Session Laws of Utah, 1921:

1. That immediately after their appointment, the Board of Supervisors of the Cache County Drainage District Number Four employed as engineers of the said district, Humphreys Brothers of Logan, Utah, with Hays, Sloan and Lewis of Boise, Idaho, as associate engineers, and that this Board of Supervisors with the said engineers having examined all of the lands proposed to be drained or protected and the lands over or upon which the work is proposed to be constructed; that the said engineers have made a complete survey and maps of the lands within the said district as well as exhaustive investigation of sub-surface conditions both with reference to the soil and to the ground water; that the said engineers have made a detailed written report to the Board of Supervisors of the results of their survey and investigation and a copy of the said report is submitted to the County Commissioners with this report for their reference and further

(a) "Whether the proposed work and the proposed location thereof are in all respects proper and feasible; and if not, what is or are so."

The drainage system proposed in the petition for the organization of the district is feasible and proper except for the changes hereinafter mentioned. Some of the drains on account of flat slopes, quicksand and large discharge, necessarily should be open ditches and concrete tile may properly be substituted for clay tile under certain conditions. That a proper description of the feasible drainage system for the said land is as follows:

The primary system consists of the following drains.

The primary system includes: Drain No. 1 an open ditch except for the upper 1/4 mile emptying into Bear River and running up the slough from the southeast to the northwest corners of the district: Drain No. 2. an open ditch except for the upper 1/2 mile emptying into the Ransom slough at the north end of the district and running south the entire length of the district on the west side of the railroad: Drains No's. 3 & 4 having their outlets in No. 2 and No. 4A having its outlet in No. 4, all closed tile except the lower 900 ft. of No. 4 and all running along the slope below the West Cache Drain No. 5, a closed tile line, emptying into a natural Canal: watercourse at the southern boundary of the district and running along the upper edge of the wet area in that part of the district. There are a total of 4.5 miles of open ditch and 2.5 miles of closed tile drains in the primary system. The secondary system includes: Drain No. 6, a closed tile line, emptying into No. 5 and running along the slope in an easterly direction: Drains No's. 7 & 7A, open ditches in the

from an outlet in No. 9: Drain No. 11, a closed tile line in the northwest corner of the district having its outlet in No. 2. There are a total of 3.8 miles of open ditch and 1.2 miles of closed drain in the secondary system. Both systems are shown on the map prepared by the engineer and attached hereto and which is made a part of this report and to which reference is hereby made for further particulars thereof.

(b) "the probable cost of the work mentioned in the petition, including all incidental expenses, and the cost of the proceedings therefor:"

The probable aggregate cost of the proposed work, including all incidental expenses and cost of organization will be \$125,000.00, for the primary system alone, or \$175,000.00 for both the primary and secondary systems.

(c) "The probable annual cost of keeping the same in repair after the work is completed;"

The probable annual cost of keeping the system in repair based on the construction of both the primary and secondary systems will be \$900.00.

(d) "What lands will be injured by the proposed work, and the probable aggregate amount of all damages such lands will sustain by reason of the laying out and construction of such work; and what lands, if any, should be excluded from the district;"

That no lands will be injured by the said drainage system, except that there will be required a strip of land 100 feet wide taken for right of way for the open ditches. There will be no damage caused by the construction of the closed drains as they are all on land which is practically non-productive at the present time. The aggregate amount of the damage will be \$15,760.00. No lands should be excluded from the

benefits will exceed the total cost of constructing the drainage system including all incidental expenses, cost of proceedings and damages. The aggregate amount of the benefits will be \$310,000.00.

(f) "Whether the proposed district as set out in the petition filed will embrace all the lands that may be damaged or benefitted by the proposed work; and if not, to report what additional lands will be so affected."

The district as proposed in the petition will embrace all the lands which will be benefitted by the construction of the drainage system.

And the Board of Supervisors having found that the benefits derived from the said drainage system will exceed the costs and expenses of the construction and maintenance and damages and respectfully requests that this report be accepted by the Board of County Commissioners in the manner and form prescribed by law.

Wood, protests on three parcels -- 39 acres of pasture north of the County Road needs no drainage; 35 acres of bench goun d so high that he irrigated it by pumping water to it; 25 acres drained by a private drain ditch. Asks that the entire tract of 99 acres should be eliminated from the district.

Robert M. Austin asks for the elimination of his land as he received no benefits.

Edwin W. Bingham objects on the grounds that his 79.35 acres is assessed at \$50.00 and he claims it is so high, it could not be benefited by drainage.

Mary E. Bingham protests that she would receive no benefits .

- J. J. Jensen says that his lands are so sandy that he would receive no benefits; he feels that the benefits assessed are very unjust.
- A. J. Hill, protests that his land in "Section 35, should not be in the drainage district. He would receive no benefits.

Robert Austin objects to the assessment of three acres of ground as no benefits would be received.

Louis Purser , represented by A.J. Hill, protests that he would receive no benefits .

Cache County Board of Education, represented by Albert McCann ,protests the assessment on 1.7 acres on the grounds that they were raising nothing on this tract but the standards of education and he believes that the drainage would not benefit them.

West Cache Canal derives no benefit and asks to have their grounds eliminated.

Oregon Short Line Bailroad represented by Mr. Sawyer, objects to the assessment of \$125.00 per acre on their right-of-way because they are already protected against water; also, that their land is misclassified and no benefits will be derived. He disclaims any benefits to their right-of way in this district, and dontends that it is inconsistent to include their Iproperty for assessment only.

Eliza Jane Lott protests on the grounds that at least 15 acres of her land requires lots of irrigation. She also objects to A. grade land being assessed more than B and C, while B. and C is most benefited. Her representative, claims that she was induced to sign for a drainage district by the representation that it would cost not more than \$25.00 per acre complete, whereas now, they conceive the cost to be at least \$46.00 per acre.

REPORT.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CACHE COUNTY, UTAH; and To All Persons Interested in the Cache County, Drainage District #4:

Comes now the Board of Supervisors of Cache County Drainage District #4, and hereby makes and files with the Board of Cache County Commissioners its report setting forth the nature of the work done and accomplished since the organization of said district together with a statement of the moneys received and expended during said period of time and up until the date of making this report. This report is made in conformity with the requirements of the Statutes of the State of Utah and respectfully shows as follows:

That J. E. Robson, A. J. Harper and Jøseph Peterson filed in the Office of the County Clerk on May 31st, 1931, a petition whereby they set forth that certain lands in Cache County were susceptible of drainage, describing therein the lands to be included therein and the signatures of the owners of such lands both residents and non-residents of Cache County, Utah, and that thereafter, to-wit: on the 31st day of May, 1921, filed an undertaking in the sum of \$1680.00; and that thereafter, by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, dated May 31st, 1921, it was ordered that Friday, the 1st day of July, 1921, at 2 o'clock P. M., at the County Court House in Logan, Utah, be and the same was thereby fixed as the time and place for hearing said petition and that due and legal notice of the hearing thereon was given by advertisement in the Logan Republican, a newspaper published tri-weekly in Logan, Cache County, Utah; that notice was duly and regally given and posted as shown by the records and files in this matter, and by publication; and that a hearing on said petition was had before the County Commissioners on the 11th day of July, 1921, and at said hearing by resolution adopted by said Board of County Commissioners, said lands described in said petition comprising 3360 acres of land were incorporated into and made a part of Cache County Drainage District #4; and the petition granted and approved in all respects; and that J. E. Robson of Trenton, Utah, was appointed a member of the Board of Supervisors of said district for a term of three years; that A. J. Harper of Trenton, Utah, was appointed a member of the Board of Supervisors of said district for a term of two years; that Joseph Peterson of Trenton, Utah, was appointed a member of the Board of Supervisors of said district for a period of one year, upon their filing and executing an official bond to the district for the sum of \$2,000.00; and that by due and legal proclamation of the County Commissioners of Cache County, dated July 11th, 1921, said district was duly and regularly created and said persons duly and regularly appointed as aforesaid; and that due and legal publication of said proclamation was made as more fully appears by the records and files in this matter, and proof of publication thereof.

That a map and plat showing the lands to be embraced in said district was caused to be made by said Board of Supervisors and filed in this matter; that immediately after their appointment the Board of Supervisors of said district, employed as engineers thereon, Humphreys Brothers of Logan, Utah, with Hays, Sloan and Lewis of Boise, Idaho, as associate engineers; and that said Board of Supervisors examined all of the lands proposed to be in said district and the work proposed to be constructed; and that the said engineers above mentioned and the said Board of Super-

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visors made a complete report which said report is referred to hereby in the records and files of this matter and made a part hereof as rully and completely as if set forth herein and that such report was heard before the Board of County Commissioners of Cache County, Utah, on February 7, 1923, at 2 o'clock P. M., and at said meeting such report was accepted and ordered filed.

That thereafter said Board of Supervisors made and set forth an estimate of the benefits and the assessment of benefits to be levied against the property owners and property embraced in said district and by notice of assessment dated February 7th, 1923, notified the owners of said lands that on the 5th day of February, 1923, the Board of Super-visors of Cache County Drainage District #4, had filed with the Board of County Commissioners their assessment of benefits stating therein the assessment against each property owner according to the acreage owned within the district, and that on the 26th day of February, 1923, the Board of County Commissioners would sit as a Board of Equalization in the matters of such assessment benefits and taxes and that said notices were posted and deposited in the Post Office of the United States addressed to each of the owners of lands embraced within the district at Logan, Utah, all of which more fully appears by the records and files in this matter; that on February 28th, 1923, said Board of Supervisors filed a statement and estimate of the amount of money to be raised for taxation for the year 1923, all of which more fully appears by the records and files in this matter.

That on the 5th day of February, 1923, said Board of Supervisors caused to be filed in the office of the County Clerk of Cache County, in this matter, a complete and detailed map of all of the lands embraced in said district as organized which said map is referred hereto and made a part of this report; that on such date said Board made and caused to be made as an assessment of benefits to all of the lands in said district taking into consideration all of the damages and benefits to each particular tract of land arising from or due to the construction of and maintenance of the proposed drainage estimate; that in said assessment of benefits, the lands therein were divided into three classes, to-wit:

Class "A", lands on which the benefits were assessed at \$125.00 an acre;

Class "B" lands on which the benefits were assessed at \$100.00 an acre;

Class "C" lands on which the benefits were assessed at \$75.00 an acre;

and that the assessment roll upon said lands was duly and regularly made up and submitted on said date to the Board of County Commissioners of Cache County, Utah, describing each particular tract of land within the district, the name of the owner, the acreage embraced and the total assessment of benefits less damages; and that the Board of County Commissioners sat on the 26th day of February, 1923, as a Board of Equalization and did thereupon by resolution duly passed, adopt and file said assessment of benefits as theretofore submitted by said Board of Supervisors and confirm said assessment except as to the lands allotted to two persons to-wit: Alois Miller and Steve Campora as more fully appears and is set forth in the resolution passed by the Board of County Commissioners dated May 26th, 1923, as shown by the records and files in this matter.

That ever since the appointment of said Board of Supervisors as aforesaid, the same Board of Supervisors has been and does now continue to act as such Board of Supervisors; that no other persons have been appointed or elected to act as such, nor has any successor in office been appointed, elected or qualified.

That during the period of the encumbancy of the said Board of Supervisors, all of the preliminary work, investigation and data has been compiled and submitted heretofore and that the primary and secondary esti-

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mate of drainage has heretofore been outlined including the probable cost of the work to be done, the aggregate cost of the proposed work, including all incidental costs and expenses connected therewith also the probable actual cost of keeping said systemts in repair and good order; and that an estimate was made of the damage to be done to all of the lands embraced in said district and the benefits derived from such construction and maintenance, all of which more fully appears in the Supervisors' Report dated January 30, 1923, to which reference is hereby made and said report is a part hereof.

That taxes were levied against said properties comprising said district during and for the year 1923 in the amount of \$4657.50; and that thereafter no taxes nor assessments were levied against said properties and that during the year 1923, there was the sum of \$1992.18 collected as taxes within said district by the Treasurer of Cache County; and that up to the present time the sum of \$2144.09 taxes, and \$90.00 penalty and costs have been collected; that there is now unpaid taxes in the amount of \$241.00 taxes, and \$23.27 penalty and costs; and that a total sum of taxes, penalty and costs in the sum of \$4686.49 have been collected as remittances from Cache County on account of taxes; that for the purpose of securing legal work and services in connection with said district, it was necessary to employ attorneys and that by an agreement dated November 1st, 1921, between said district and Walters and Harris, attorneys, it was agreed to pay the said attorneys at the rate of 35¢ per acre of land embraced in said district; and that for the purpose of securing engineering services, it was necessary and convenient to enter into an agreement and that on the 7th day of November, 1921, said district and T. H. Humphreys entered into an agreement whereby the said T. H. Humphreys agreed to perform the engineering work on said Drainage District to its completion for which services the said district agreed to pay at the rate of \$1.25 per acre of lands included in said district and that the amount of moneys expended in pursuance of said contract are more fully set forth in the accounting rendered herewith, marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

tion and work necessary it became necessary, convenient and properto borrow money and that the Board of Supervisors borrowed from the Cache Valley Banking Company of Logan, on November 10, 1921, the sum of \$2500.00 and in evidence thereof executed a promissory note in such sum and on said date, payable on May 10, 1922, with interest at the rate of 8% per annum; and that thereafter it became necessary to secure further and additional sums of money and said Board of Supervisors in the name of said district secured an additional sum of \$880.55 and executed its promissory note on March 15, 1922, in the sum of \$3450.00 with interest at the rate of 8% per annum; that said first mentioned note was paid and discharged by the execution of said second mentioned note, the proceeds from which said notes are more fully set forth in Exhibit "A" heretofore mentioned and that all and every part of said notes have been and are now fully paid and discharged and that there are no debts and obligations now outstanding against said district.

There is herewith submitted a complete report of the moneys collected, income and moneys expended during the administration of said Board of Supervisors and which said Exhibit "A" is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

WHEREFORE, said Board of Supervisors respectfully requiest that this report be filed in the records and files in this matter and that the Board of County Commissioners set a date according to law for the hearing of said report and that due and legal notice of such hearing be given as provided by the laws of the State of Utah.

E. W. Bingham chosen for three year term. Mr. Harper nominated by acclamation for two year term. Motion Mr. G. F. Litz be nominated for one year term.

Meeting is adjourned.
