

P E T I T I O N

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners in and for the said
Cache County, State of Utah:

Your petitioners respectfully submit the following:

(1) That your petitioners comprise more than one-half of the owners
of title or evidence of title to lands ~~within~~ the area proposed herein to be
organized as a drainage district in the name of the Cache County Drainage
District No. 2, in Cache County, State of Utah, and that they own and
control more than ^{one-half} ~~one-third~~ of the area proposed to be included in the organi-
zation, which lands are susceptible of reclamation by drainage; and your
petitioners desire to provide for the reclamation of the said lands include
within the area as hereinafter bounded and described.

(2) The lands which your petitioners desire to have included with
the proposed drainage district are situated in the said County of Cache,
State of Utah, and the boundaries of the proposed district are as follows:

(3) The starting points, routes and termini and general description of the proposed drainage systems are as follows:

Drain A:- Beginning at a point in the Bear River near the northwest corner of Sec. 31, Tp. 13, North, Range 1 East, Salt Lake Base and Meridian, extending in a general southeasterly direction and terminating near the south boundary of Sec. 31.

Drain B:- Beginning at a point in Hopkins Slough near the northwest corner of Sec. 7, Tp. 12 North, Range 1 East, Salt Lake Base and Meridian, extending in a southeasterly direction to a point near the center of Sec. 7, thence east to a point near the center of Sec. 8, thence northeasterly to a point near the southwest corner of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Sec. 8, thence east to the west line of Sec. 10, Tp. 12 North, Range 1 East of the Salt Lake Base and Meridian.

Drain C:- Beginning at a point in the Big Slough near ^{west} the ~~south quarter corner of Sec. 18,~~ ^{west} ~~the southwest corner of Sec. 18,~~ Tp. 12 North, Range 1 East of the Salt Lake Base and Meridian, extending in a northeasterly direction and terminating at a point near the north quarter corner of Sec. 18.

Together with the necessary interior drainage required to effect the efficient reclamation of the lands within the district boundaries.

Drain D:- Beginning at a point in the Bear River near the west quarter corner of Sec. 34, Tp. 13, N., R. 1 W., S. L. B. & M., extending easterly and northwesterly through Secs. 34, 35, 26 and 25, and terminating at a point near the north quarter corner of the SW 1/4 of Sec. 5.

(4) Your petitioners herewith submit a true copy of the equalized county assessment roll for the year 1920 being the roll next preceding the presentation of this petition for the organization of the said drainage district, as shown by the records and assessment roll in the office of the county assessor of Cache County, State of Utah, as evidence of the ownership and title to the said described lands, which said copy of said assessment roll is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and made a part of this petition.

(5) Your petitioners herewith append an affidavit giving a list of non-residents who own land within the boundaries of the proposed district together with their places of residence when known, and where not known, stating the fact and that upon diligent inquiry they could not be ascertained, which said affidavit is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit B" and made a part of this petition.

(6) Your petitioners herewith present an indemnity bond in the sum of \$3420 which is equivalent to 2 per cent of the estimated cost of the proposed drainage work, conditioned for the payment of any organization, preliminary and other lawful costs, in the event that this petition is denied or that, upon investigation, it is found that the cost of improvement will be in excess of the benefits to be derived, thereby necessitating the dismissal of the proceedings, which said indemnity bond is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit C" and made a part of this petition.

Wherefore, your petitioners respectfully pray as follows:

(1) That pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 95 of the Session Laws of Utah, 1913, and amendments thereto, the land above described and bounded be organized into a drainage district to be known as Cache County Drainage District No. 2, in the County of Cache, State of Utah; that said lands

may be drained and reclaimed and protected.

(2) That your honorable body fix a time and place for a hearing on this petition, and that due and legal notice of the time and place of the hearing upon said petition and the purpose for which the petition will be heard, be given as required by law, to all parties interested.

Your petitioners further pray that the said petition be granted; that the proposed drainage district be organized as a body corporate and that three drainage supervisors be appointed as provided by statute.



(5) Your petitioners herewith append an affidavit giving a list of non-residents who own land within the boundaries of the proposed district together with their places of residence when known, and where not known, stating the fact and that upon diligent inquiry they could not be ascertained, which said affidavit is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit B" and made a part of this petition.

(6) Your petitioners herewith present an indemnity bond in the sum of \$4400⁰⁰ which is equivalent to 2 percent of the estimated cost of the proposed drainage work, conditioned for the payment of any organization, preliminary and other lawful costs, in the event that this petition is denied or that, upon investigation, it is found that the cost of improvement will be in excess of the benefits to be derived, thereby necessitating the dismissal of the proceedings, which said indemnity bond is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit C" and made a part of this petition.

Wherefore, your petitioners respectfully pray as follows:

(1) That pursuant to the provisions of Title 26 of the Compiled Laws of Utah, 1917, and amendments thereto, the land above described and bounded be organized into a drainage district to be known as Cache County Drainage District No. 2, in the County of Cache, State of Utah; that said lands may be drained and reclaimed and protected.

(2) That your honorable body fix a time and place for a hearing on this petition, and that due and legal notice of the time and place of the hearing upon said petition and the purpose for which the petition will be heard, be given as required by law, to all parties interested.

Your petitioners further pray that the said petition be granted; that the proposed drainage district be organized as a body corporate and that three drainage supervisors be appointed as provided by statute.

SUPERVISORS REPORT.

TO THE HON. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CACHE
COUNTY UTAH.

Comes now the Board of Supervisors of the Cache County Drainage District Number two, and hereby makes and files with the Board of County Commissioners of Cache County, Utah, its findings and report pursuant to the provisions of section 2053 and section 2054, Chapter 41 Session Laws of 1919, as amended by Chapter 47 of the Session Laws of Utah 1921.

That immediately after the appointment, the Board of Supervisors of the Cache County Drainage District Number Two, employed as engineers of the said District, Humphreys Brothers, of Logan, Utah, with Hays, Sloan and Lewis, of Boise, Idaho as associates engineers, and that this Board of Supervisors with the engineers having examined all of the lands proposed to be drained or protected, and the lands over or upon which the work is proposed to be constructed; that the said engineers have made a complete survey and maps of the lands within the said district as well as exhaustive investigation of sub-surface conditions both with reference to the soil and to the ground water; that the said engineers have made a detailed written report to the Board of Supervisors of the results of their survey and investigations, and a copy of said report is submitted to the County Commissioners with this report for their reference and further information.

That from the said examination by the supervisors and report of the said engineers, this Board makes the following findings and report:-

"(a) Whether the proposed work and the proposed location thereof are in all respects proper and feasible; and if not, what is or are so".

The drainage system proposed in the petition for the organization of the district is feasible and proper. Some of the drains on account of flat slopes and quicksand and large discharge, necessarily should be open ditches and concrete tile may properly be substituted for clay tile under certain conditions.

The primary system consists of the following drains:-

- " (b) The probable cost of the work mentioned in the petition including all incidental expenses, and the cost of the proceedings therefor".

The probable cost of the proposed work including all incidental expenses and costs of organization will be \$294,000.00

- "(c) The probable annual cost of keeping the same in repairs after the work is completed."

The probable annual cost of keeping the system in repair based on the construction of both the primary and secondary systems will be \$3,410.00.

- "(d) What lands will be injured by the proposed work, and the probable aggregate amount of all damages such lands will sustain by reason of the laying out and construction of such work; and what lands, if any, should be excluded from the district."

That no lands will be injured by the said drainage system except that there will be required a strip of land 100 feet wide taken for right of way for the open ditches. There will be no damage caused by the construction of the closed drains as they are all on land which is practically non-productive at the present time. The aggregate amount of the damages will be \$18,600.00. There should be no lands excluded from the District.

- "(e) What lands will be benefitted by the construction of the proposed work, and whether the aggregate amount of benefits will equal or exceed the cost of constructing such work, including all incidental expenses, costs of proceedings, and damages."

All of the lands in the district will be benefitted by the construction of the drainage system, except the lands taken as a right of way for the open ditches as set forth in D above. The aggregate amount of the benefits will exceed the total cost of constructing the drainage system, including all incidental expenses, costs of proceedings and damages. The aggregate amount of the benefits will be \$840,000.00.

"(f) Whether the proposed district as set out in the petition filed will embrace all the lands that may be damaged or benefitted by the proposed work; and if not, to report what additional lands will be so affected."

The district as proposed in the petition will embrace all the lands which will be benefited by the construction of the drainage system.

The Board of Supervisors having found that the benefits derived from the said drainage system will exceed the costs and expenses of the construction, maintenance, and damages, and respectfully requests that this report be accepted by the Board of County Commissioners in the manner and form prescribed by law.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Cache County Drainage District Number 2, have heretofore presented to the Board of County Commissioners their report in writing as provided in Section 2053 and section 2054 of Chapter 41 of the Session Laws of Utah 1919, as amended by Chapter 47 of the Session Laws of Utah, 1921, a copy of which said report is hereby filed with the official files in the office of the County Clerk in the County Court House of Cache County, Utah, and the Supervisors having reported:

1. That the drainage system proposed in the petition and the organization of the District is feasible and proper.
2. That the probable cost of the work mentioned in the petition including all incidental expenses and the cost of the proceedings therefor, is the sum of \$294,000.
3. That the probable annual cost of keeping the same in repair after the same is completed will be the sum of \$2,410.00.
4. That no lands will be injured by the said drainage system, except that it will require a strip of land 100 feet wide taken for a right of way for the open drains. That the aggregate amount of the damages done by said drainage system will be the sum of \$18,600.00, and that there should be no lands excluded from the said district.
5. That all of the lands in said district will be benefitted by the construction of the drainage system, except the lands taken as a right of way for the open ditches as set forth above. That the aggregate amount of the benefits will exceed the total cost of constructing the drainage system, including all incidental expenses, cost of proceedings and damages. That the aggregate amount of the benefits will be the sum of \$840,000.
6. That the district as proposed in the petition will embrace all of the lands which will be benefitted by the construction of the drainage system. That the Board of Supervisors recommend that the report be accepted by the Board of County Commissioners, in the manner and form prescribed by law, Now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the report of the Board of Supervisors of Cache County Drainage District Number 2, be and the same is hereby accepted and ordered filed as a part of the records of said District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the findings of said Board of Supervisors as set forth in said report be and the same is hereby approved and ratified.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners hereby find that the said work proposed in said petition and the proposed location thereof are in all respects proper and feasible, and that the probable cost of said work including all incidental costs and the costs of organization will be the sum of \$294,000; that the probable cost of keeping the same in repair after the work is completed will be the sum of \$2,410.00; that the aggregate amount of damages sustained by the said lands due to the construction of said drainage system, will be the sum of \$18,600.00, and that no lands should be excluded from the said district; that the aggregate amount of the benefits derived from the construction of the said drainage system will be the sum of \$840,000; that the district as proposed in said petition will embrace all of the lands which will be benefitted by the construction of the drainage system.

Protests from District No. Two.

Reuben A. Perkes protests on 13 acres on the grounds that it has a natural drain and would receive no benefits. And on 23.5 acres which is already tiled drained with 6 inch tile.

Lars Christensen protests on the grounds that the drain runs below his land and he could receive no benefits from it.

M. C. Reeder complains that the acreage assessed against him is in excess of his holdings.

P. C. Chambers complains that his land is assessed too high and misclassified, as ten acres are assessed at \$125.00 when it should be in the \$50.00 class. He has 5 acres in section four (4) assessed at \$125.00 which should be assessed at \$50.00.

Oregon Short Line Railroad Company, represented by E. M. Sawyer, says his Company is assessed with 35.68 acres at \$5652.00 and he claims that the acreage should not exceed 27.5 acres as that is as much as could possibly receive any benefits. He also contends that drainage is in part made necessary by reason of irrigation above the tracks. The Out of 13,500 feet in this district, 8,000 feet would receive some benefits. If the primary laterals on the main lines of the drain were under the track in four places, they will accept this assessment on 27.5 acres at the maximum A grade for expense incurred.

Hansina Christensen protests that she has only 45.5 acres which does not need draining and she is assessed with 47.00 acres and 6.25 acres.

A. M. Tombs protests that she does not need to drain, nor want to drain.

Mrs. A. L. Farrell protests on 20 acres. She claims that she will not be benefited.

Mrs. John W. Reese protests on 71 acres. That she doesn't need draining and would receive no benefits.

F. C. Lee protests that he is assessed too much land and that his land is now tiled drained and he would receive no benefits.

U. I. C. Railroad Company represented by D. L. Stine, P.H. Mulchay, and H.C. Errett protests on the grounds that they would not be benefited. They have a strip only 66 feet wide for a right-of-way and they request the elimination of their right-of-way from the district, but they would be willing to place culverts under their track, although their road bed is adequately drained.

James Hind protests that his lands do not need draining and he would receive no benefits.

A. J. Reese protests that his land does not need draining and he would receive no benefits.

R. L. Reese protests that his land would not justify the expense of draining.

Christian Larsen protests on 20 acres ;that his valuation is too high--

amounting to double the value of the land.

C. W. Anderson protests and claims that he is assessed with 160 acres of land while 40 acres is all that he has that needs draining.

George Cowley protests that on 10 acres he has a private drain and this ten should be eliminated from the district and he has 25 acres assessed at \$125.00 per acre and which is three times as much as the land is worth. He recommends a blanket assessment to pay the preliminary costs.

Joseph R. Hebaush protests that his land does not need draining; he would receive no benefits.

E. Berger protests that he is assessed with 2 acres more land than he has, and that the valuation is too high.

William Balls protests that he would receive no benefits on 14 acres west of the Railroad as the soil is too shallow.

Phillip Purser protests that he has a tile drain which drains about one half of his land, therefore he would receive no benefits.

Charles L. Reese complains that 10 acres of his land is assessed at \$125.00 and should be in the \$50.00 class.

Lester Morse protests that the assessments of benefits are too high. That he would be benefited on the north side of his land but not on the south.

Joseph P. Daines protests that he has 13 acres already drained and consequently would receive no benefits.

Clyde Daines protests on the grounds that his land is already drained.

R.H. Alliston protests that his valuation is too high.

Abraham Smith protests that he will receive no benefits and asks that his land be eliminated from the district.

J. W. D. Hurren protests that he is assessed with 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres which should be 18 acres. The excess being caused by his having to obtain deeds to correct the description in his original deed.

I drained my land in the Fall of 1918, and since then, there has never been any time that my land has been too wet, in fact, I must stop up the drains in mid-summer, and during the whole year the west half must be irrigated. Now why must I pay to have land drained that is drained, and I can get a girl good proof of it. Furthermore I have never


