# LOGAN - CACHE AIRPORT AUTHORITY BOARD MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 6, 2012

The Logan-Cache Airport Authority Board convened in a regular session on November 6, 2012 at 7:30 a.m. in the Cache County Council Chambers, County Historic Courthouse, 199 North Main, Logan, Utah.

#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman John Kerr called the meeting to order at 7:29 a.m.

#### **REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Kerr asked for a motion to approve the minutes of October 2, 2012.

ACTION: Motion was made by Walton and seconded by Francis to approve the minutes of October 2, 2012. The vote in favor was unanimous, 6-0 with 1 absent.

#### ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

**Manager's Report – Lee Ivie** (Attachment A) Ivie presented his report which is attached as a part of these minutes.

#### **Hangar Construction:**

Leonard Hebert has submitted a request for a 60' x 60' hangar at either of two locations. Janos Lakatos has also submitted a request for a 60' x 80' hangar either right next to the proposed Hebert hangar site or at the end of taxiway Alpha. Quayle asked about the drainage problems in that area. Ivie responded that Hebert and Lakatos will be required to build drainage to the west of the buildings. Ivie said that Herbert has asked the Airport Authority Board to select the best location for him. It was decided that either location is fine with the board and Herbert can choose the location he likes best. There was some discussion about the utilities in that area that will need to be addressed by the Airport Authority Board in the future. Kerr also brought up the point that Hebert may not have enough space next to the Clark hangar when factoring in the additional 10 feet on the north side of the hangar required by Logan City as a firewall. Ivie said he and Hebert will measure the area and choose the location best suited for the proposed hangar.

Francis reported to the chairman that there is a group of hangar owners who are willing to install a new 6" culvert on the east side of taxilane Echo between taxilanes Alpha and Bravo if the Airport Authority Board will purchase it. The group is also asking for permission to flush out the existing culverts in that area with a fire hose to get rid of the silt buildup. Chief Peterson said he will provide the fire hose and will also assist in flushing the culverts out. Ivie said he will get some measurements of the area and order the culvert.

CIP Report – Armstrong Consultants, Dennis Corsi and John Manée (Attachment B) Kerr invited representatives from Armstrong to present the Capital Improvement Plan for the Logan-Cache Airport. They distributed to board members the *Airport Development Plan Project List* and an accompanying map that are attached as a part of these minutes. The development plan lists all the proposed capital projects for the airport beginning with the year 2013 and continuing to the year 2023. Corsi stated that the annual CIP submittal to the FAA and the state is due at the end of the month. He noted that this will be done using a new online web-based submittal program.

The projects for 2013 are all priority pavement projects identified by the Airport Authority Board. The projects for 2014 are primarily electrical projects as well as some equipment acquisition. Corsi noted that by grouping similar projects together, they will be able to achieve maximum economy of scale for each type of project. He added that several of the 2014 projects will be instrumental in correcting the inspection issues including the realignment of the runway edge lights and the installation of the lighted wind cone and PAPI. Corsi referred to the map which indicates the taxiway Juliet location, the taxiway Charlie shift and reconstruct, and the north apron reconstruct. He asked the board members if the list, as outlined, adequately represents their priorities and if Armstrong could submit it to the state and FAA. Lemon asked how likely it will be that we will receive the money for the 2013 projects. Francis said he attended the meeting where the proposed funding was discussed and thought it sounded very positive that the funding will come. Corsi said that they can submit the proposal by the end of the week and then schedule a conference call to find out how much funding we will receive for 2013.

Some discussion followed concerning the shift and reconstruction of taxiway Charlie. Corsi noted that after the reconstruct, the existing taxiway Charlie will then become part of the North Apron Rehab project. Ivie said that some aerial and ground photos of the project areas should be submitted with the CIP for consideration. Corsi said that he could do that as well as have the photos to show when he has the online meeting with the FAA.

Kerr asked Corsi if the Plan Project List can include a more detailed description of each project. Corsi said that Armstrong has a separate narrative sheet that accompanies each project on the list which describes the project, the dimensional criteria, the justification and rationale behind it and includes a map sketch of the project area. He said he will provide that information to the board members.

#### Report of the Fall UAOA Conference - Gar Walton

Walton said the conference provided a great opportunity to meet with other airports from throughout the state and discuss issues that pertain to airport management and exchange ideas that benefit everyone. He said this year there was a lot of discussion about TSA security issues for airports with commercial service. Another session covered General Aviation airport and energy efficiency strategies. He attended a presentation on land acquisition and the particular challenges associated with property and airports. Walton said that one of the most informative sessions covered the two airports in Utah that recently had commercial service added. He noted that the Provo airport experience didn't last very long and they have lost their commercial service. Walton said that he was most interested in what the Ogden airport had to go through in order to obtain commercial service. They had to build an additional building to tie into their existing terminal facility to accommodate the TSA security requirements. In addition, there were numerous requirements and regulations they had to go through for TSA and other entities. He concluded that considering all the requirements an airport has to complete in order to obtain commercial service, the airport governing body should be pretty certain that the commercial airline commitment is sound and that it will be sustainable for an extended period of time. Discussion followed concerning what caused Provo to lose its commercial service after such a short period of time. The board members agreed that it was a good thing to see these examples considering our airports past efforts in procuring commercial service.

#### **Committee Reports**

#### **Audit & Finance – Lynn Lemon** (Attachment C)

Lemon presented the proposed 2013 Airport Budget which is attached as a part of these minutes. It is not in its final form. He asked board members to review it and get with him if they have any questions or concerns with it. He suggested we submit the budget as is and added that it can always be amended to add the funding for the CIP projects if and when they are approved.

#### **Operations Committee – Dean Quayle**

Quayle said he has met with Ivie to start a review of the Rules and Regulations document.

#### Capital Improvements - Bill Francis

Francis said we should seriously consider purchasing the Autocar ten-wheel truck from Logan City that was mentioned in Ivie's Manager's Report. The airport is not adequately prepared to deal with large amounts of snow with the equipment we have now.

#### **Economic Development / Public Relations – Gar Walton**

Walton asked Kerr and Quayle to review a rough draft of the webpage advertising the air race group coming next year. This will also help in the development of the Spotlight Presentations we will be giving to the UAOA and other organizations.

#### Open Items

Kerr asked Lemon about the 4200 North utility easement document for Hyde Park. Lemon said it is being drafted by the attorney's office for the county and the airport to sign. Lemon said once it is completed and signed, it should satisfy Hyde Park City's concerns regarding the overlay. Corsi requested a legal description and recording information after the document is finalized so they can update the maps to properly reflect that easement.

#### **Next Meeting**

The next meeting of the Airport Authority Board will be December 4, 2012 commencing at 7:30 a.m.

#### Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 8:31 a.m.

#### October 2012 Manager's Report

#### • AIP Projects:

- 1. Both State funded AIP projects (South Ramp Rehab & Runway 17/35 fog seal and paint stripping) have been completed. Final requests for reimbursement to the UDOT Department of Aeronautics will have to be submitted before these projects can be closed out. A final inspection will be made by Craig Ide from the state department of transportation.
- 2. On November 8, 2012 the Wildlife Hazard Assessment conducted by Creamer Noble Inc. will commence. A start-up meeting has been scheduled at 2:00 p.m. that afternoon, and members of the Airport Advisory Board are invited to attend that meeting. In addition to board members we hope to see representation from our FBOs, USU & Mountain Ridge flight school staff, and other airport tenants and/or operators who will need to be apprised of the procedures that will be implemented as part of this yearlong study. This meeting will take place on the main ramp area outside of the airport manager's office.
- 3. Materials for the water and sewer lines to the northwest hangar development area have been delivered, and construction will begin in mid-November. Airport users need to be advised that only one lane of traffic on airport road will be open for a fair portion of this project. The project will be ongoing for most of the winter season.
- 4. An updated capital improvement project (CIP) list will need to be submitted to the Denver Airports District Office (ADO) by November 30, 2012. These projects may be approved or rejected, but it is important that we put in our wish list for the next five years. State funded projects will need to be submitted to UDOT as separate items. (A more detailed description of CIP projects will be presented by Armstrong Consultants)

#### • Hangar Construction:

- 1. Hangar G-9 built by Jerry Clark has been completed, but additional excavation work need to be done in order to provide adequate drainage away from the hangar and taxiway gulf.
- 2. Logan-Cache Airport will be receiving federal funding to build taxiway Juliet. This is the taxiway needed to provide access to the northwest hangar development area. (More details will be discussed in the CIP report from Armstrong Consultants.)
- 3. At the present time there are five requests for property at the airport for future hangars.

#### • Airport Grounds, Buildings, and Equipment.

1. The airport staff is requesting an extension from the FAA for four corrective items to be completed as outlined in our last safety inspection. The four item include 1) adding a two foot section of surface over the west end of northwest canal which runs under taxiway bravo, 2) the replacement of six electrical boxes and covers next to runways 28 & 35 and taxiways B1 & B2 in order to meet weight bearing capacity, 3) relocation of half of the runway lights along the sides of runway 17/35 and the installation of additional lights on

- taxiway bravo, and 4) the installation of a new lighted wind sock in the middle of the segmented circle.
- 2. The snow and ice control personnel have completed the airport grounds driver's training course, and are on call for the winter snow removal operations. The Autocar truck owned by the airport is presently in the county shop having some maintenance work done, but one Ford truck and an Oskosh snow blower owned by the city of Logan are presently parked at the airport. Personnel and equipment from both the City of Logan and Cache County will assist in snow removal operations this winter. It has been brought to my attention that the City Of Logan will be selling one of their Autocar ten wheel dump trucks with an eleven foot plow at the end of this year. The airport board may want to consider purchasing this vehicle because the truck that we presently own is old and rusted out. The airport shop has been reorganized to allow for as many vehicles as possible to be parked inside this winter. The two trailers that have field closure Xs mounted on them take up a considerable amount of shop area. We may need to find a place to store these trailers this winter.

#### • Airport Property Easements:

All of the documents that were requested by the FAA District Office in Denver in regards to the two land easements at both ends of Runway 35/17 have been submitted to their office. Kristin Brownson is reviewing this material and a signed statement releasing this property should be forthcoming. It doesn't appear that litigation over the property at the south end of the airport will be necessary.

#### • Safety Incident:

A runway incursion incident was reported by the USU safety officer which occurred on Sunday October 21st at 10:03 a.m. It was reported that while they were conducting training exercises on runway 10/28 two pickup trucks crossed the end of runway 10, parked their trucks about 200 feet northeast of the runway, set up targets in the field near the runway, and began a target shooting exercise. The vehicles drove off and back on to the movement area four times without lights or radios able to monitor air traffic on 122.8. We are still investigating this incident to try to find out who the perpetrators were.

#### • Einvoicing System:

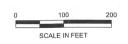
On November 1, 2012 all requests for reimbursement on federal funded projects will have to be submitted through the new einvoicing system. Training was conducted via the internet for all invitees to this program which consisted of airport managers, consultants, public officials, etc. We do have the option to allow our engineering consultants to continue to process requests for reimbursements, but it is recommended that the sponsor of each airport should review all invoices and make the individual requests for reimbursement. The process of using this system will take some time getting used to, and we may want to make include our consultants in this process.
