OPENING REMARKS AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Vice Chairman Hansen gave the opening remarks and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to approve the amended agenda as written. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to approve the minutes of the May 08, 2007, Council meeting as written. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE: M. LYNN LEMON

APPOINTMENTS: Deon Johnson County Library Board

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to approve the recommended appointment. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

WARRANTS: There were no warrants.

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OTHER ITEMS

- <u>Disposition of Old Computer Materials</u> Lemon proposed that it is more profitable to the county to offer used computer equipment/materials for purchase by county workers and distributed a memo from Attorney Daines outlining procedures and value/pricing.
- Resolution HR 811 Lemon reported that there is legislation being considered in the Federal congress to eliminate the electronic voting process and urged the Council to support this resolution against that legislation. Clerk Zollinger noted that Utah and Davis County have already passed a similar resolution.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to approve a Resolution by the Cache County Council expressing its disapproval of the proposed "Voter Confidence and Increased Accessibility Act of 2007" (HR 811). Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

- School Voucher Issue Lemon said the Governor has indicated this issue will be on the November 2007 ballot. Lemon and Zollinger are attending a June 6, 2007, 1:00 p.m. meeting at the Lieutenant Governor's office. Zollinger said there is some confusion in the law as to who will be responsible for the election – cities or the county.
- Transportation Commission Meeting is May 23, 2007 at 9:00 a.m. in the Brigham City County Commission Chambers. The main topic for discussion will be the Cache Valley highway transfers. Lemon will attend.
- <u>Drug Offenders Reform Act Training (DORA)</u> will be on May 23, 2007 in Summit County. Lemon will attend after the Transportation Commission Meeting.
- Overview of Wild and Scenic Rivers (WSR) Process Lemon said the county received a notice from the Governor's office in March indicating they were going through another phase of the Wild and Scenic Rivers suitability study and an open house for the Cache area is being held today, May 22, 2007, from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the BRAG building. The county has until June 30, 2007 to make comment. There are 72 miles of river in Cache Valley being considered.
- <u>Trust for Public Lands</u> has requested funding to complete a survey to determine what the residents of Cache County are willing to support in regard to funding for open space. The total cost is \$18,000.00. The Trust for Public Lands will pay \$4,500.00, The Nature Conservancy will pay \$4,500.00 and the Critical Lands Committee will pay \$4,500.00 if Cache County will pay \$4,500.00.

ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

➤ <u>History Presentation</u> – Chairman Gibbons introduced Jayme Warner and asked her to tell the Council about her presentation. Warner said she had won the state history fair and will go on to compete at the national history fair in June. Her presentation was on Mary Surratt, the first woman executed in the United States.

Kenzie Hamilton, Laura Kent and Breann Sanders shared their presentation on the Helmuth Hubener Resistance Group in Germany during Hitler's reign. They also won at the state history fair and will be competing in the national history fair.

Various Items of Concern – Jay Dee Scott told the Council that there are vandalism problems in the Long Divide and Short Divide areas, particularly in the Short Divide to the Idaho Line. He has personally tracked the incidents of gates being left open, damaged fences, etc. The percentage/types of violators are:

Public utilities - 25% Teenagers - 25% Adults 45 and over - 50%

Scott said Box Elder County has not been helpful and claims the gates are in Cache County. Scott has reported the problems to the Cache County Sheriff's office and does not feel he has had any help. Scott says the private property owners can no longer handle the vandalism and asks for joint cooperation between Box Elder and Cache Counties. The hunting season is not the problem; it is the pre-hunt and post-hunt time periods when the most damage occurs.

Attorney Daines recommended that the next time Scott files a complaint with the Cache County Sheriff's office that he file a duplicate of the complaint with the County Attorney's office. Daines said his office is anxious to protect private property owners by prosecuting offenders.

➤ Proposed 2007/2008 Budget for Willow Park – Russ Akina said the proposed budget was presented to the Council at the May 8, 2007 Council meeting and asked if the Council had any questions or concerns? Petersen noted he had asked for some documentation of how the RAPZ/Restaurant Tax Funds had been used. Akina distributed a handout to the Council with pictures and dollar amounts listed for projects at the Willow Park Zoo.

Petersen asked how many years Cache County has been allocating RAPZ/Restaurant Tax funds to the zoo? Akina said the zoo is in its fourth year of that funding. Petersen said the handout only reflects about one-third of the total funding allocated. Akina said the remainder is being held for the parking lot improvement project to be completed after exhibits are updated.

Gibbons indicated the total proposed budget is \$905,880.00 with the contribution from Cache County being \$322,027.00.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to approve the proposed 2007/2008 budget for Willow Park. Yeates seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

PENDING ACTION

□ Final Plat Approval-Garland Acres Subdivision – Josh Runhaar said there had been a public hearing on this subdivision because all the property owners involved were not agreeing to the plat. As directed by the Council, Runhaar contacted Bear River Health Department with questions regarding water and wells. Bear River Health indicated that Lot 4 could have two lots, but they would have to have off-site culinary water. Gibbons quoted Hadfield's letter as saying that "there is a state law which gives me the right to prevent a subdivision and restrict conditional use permits from being issued on that same parcel that I own property on. I request this right be enforced and the Council take action accordingly." Gibbons asked Daines if that is correct. Daines responded Hadfield has the right to object, not restrict. According to affidavits from the other property owners, Mr. Hadfield is demanding his well be approved by the subdivision proponents as a condition for his signature to be obtained. Daines believes that under those circumstances, if all parties do not sign the proposed plat, that requirement can be waived and the action can proceed.

Zilles pointed out that if there is an adverse influence on his well, there is a legal avenue Hadfield can pursue.

Zilles indicated that because he has family members involved in this subdivision he would abstain from any vote.

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Hansen to approve the final plat for Garland Acres Subdivision. Petersen seconded the motion. The motion passed, 5 aye – Gibbons, Hansen, Petersen, Robison & Yeates and 1 abstention – Zilles. Chambers absent.

PUBLIC HEARINGS, APPEALS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MATTERS

PUBLIC HEARING – CONSIDERATION OF THE PURCHASE OF APPROXIMATELY 100 ACRES ADJACENT TO THE AMERICAN HERITAGE CENTER OR TO ASSIST THE AMERICAN HERITAGE CENTER TO PURCHASE THE LAND – Chairman Gibbons asked Council member Petersen to explain the proposed purchase. Petersen said the Public Hearing will have to do with assisting the Heritage Center with the land purchase and distributed a sheet with a map on the back of the property under consideration for purchase by the Heritage Center. Petersen reviewed the size, price, current market value and proposed uses of the property. The American West Heritage Center will commit \$55,000.00 and two donors have agreed to donate \$100,000.00 each if Cache County commits \$100,000.00 as evidence of local support for the project. Petersen said that the Heritage Center will begin discussions with the County immediately after purchase regarding mutually agreeable short and long term uses for the upper piece of land. The County's \$100,000.00 would be used only for loan closing costs and as part of the purchase price of the land.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to open the Public Hearing for Consideration of the Purchase of Approximately 100 Acres Adjacent to the American

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Heritage Center or to Assist the American Heritage Center to Purchase the Land. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

Chairman Gibbons opened the Public Hearing and invited comment.

Curtis Knight indicated he had made an offer on the property, but when he decided to accept the Heritage Center's counter offer, he was told it was under contract yet this is one year later and it still hasn't closed.

Brent Parker, real estate agent representing the sellers and the Heritage Center, said the family desires to sell to the Heritage Center because its uses are compatible with what the family wants for the property and have, therefore, extended the time for the Heritage Center to arrange funding.

Sandy Emile, Cache Chamber of Commerce, spoke in favor of the County assisting with the purchase.

Gary Van Powell said he was also interested in purchasing the property and questioned the fact that the wetland portion is not priced separately from the usable acreage.

Others speaking in support of the purchase were:

Steve Delong, Executive Director of the American West Heritage Center Ronda Thompson, Heritage Center Board member Cody Merchant, Heritage Center volunteer Mayor Ruth Maughan, Wellsville Shauna Kerr, Trust for Public Lands

There was no other comment.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to close the Public Hearing. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING</u> – OPEN 2007 BUDGET – Lemon reviewed adjustments to the budget. (For details see Attachment 4 to Resolution No. 2007-16-Adjustments to the 2007 Budget) Lemon told the Council that the \$4,500.00 requested by the Trust for Public Lands to conduct a survey is not included in these adjustments and asked if the Council wanted that to be included?

Chairman Gibbons said he would consider including the \$4,500.00 request if the TPL will commit that they will not ask the county to put an open space funding issue on a ballot prior to the 2008 general election.

Council member Petersen noted that the school voucher question being on the 2007 Municipal Elections ballot would change the complexion of the election. Gibbons responded that issue would interest specific groups and not necessarily promote the turnout the county would get in a general election.

Vice Chairman Hansen said he supports Gibbons' recommendation.

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Countywide Planner Morse said the proposed survey would indicate whether residents support funding for open space as well as anything else residents would or would not support in regard to open space.

Council member Yeates said he questions using tax dollars for finding out public opinion.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Robison to open the Public Hearing to Open the 2007 Budget. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

Chairman Gibbons opened the Public Hearing and invited public comment. There was none.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to close the Public Hearing. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

PENDING ACTION

	Ordinance	No.	2007-05 -	Agricultural	Subdivisions
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There was no action taken on this ordinance.

Chairman Gibbons said portions of Ordinance No. 2007-05 – Agricultural Subdivisions - will be discussed later in the meeting.

■ Motion on Residential Facilities – Josh Runhaar recommended that no action be taken on this item tonight. The planning office has been in discussions concerning this issue with the County Attorney, County Executive and planning staff and a staff decision will be forthcoming shortly.

ACTION: Motion by Vice Chairman Hansen that the Council concur with the recommendation and take no action on the motion on residential facilities. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

Gibbons said the Council will wait to hear from Runhaar before placing this item on a future agenda under pending action.

- □ <u>Discussion AG Zone, Clustering Subdivisions, and Natural Barriers</u> Runhaar reviewed possible questions to be addressed at the Public Hearing on these items. Petersen then identified the following specific questions for discussion at the Public Hearing:
 - 1. Should the maximum number of lots for a small subdivision be three?
 - 2. Should there be two zones or more with two or three options presented and what would the base zone be?
 - 3. Should the County or the property owner have the ability to initiate rezones?
 - 4. Should the County provide incentives for clustering?

Runhaar said he will prepare these questions for the Public Hearing as well as a modified version of tonight's presentation.

INITIAL PROPOSAL FOR CONSIDERATION OF ACTION

• Resolution No. 2007-16 – Adjustments to the 2007 Budget – Gibbons said this is the appropriate time to discuss any issues the Council has concerns about as well as the American West Heritage proposal since those numbers have been included in the adjustments to the budget.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to waive the rules and approve Resolution No. 2007-16-Adjustments to the 2007 Budget. Yeates seconded the motion.

Discussion on the motion:

Yeates said he was initially opposed to tax dollars being used for a project like this, but after discussions with Gibbons and Petersen, he feels differently.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to amend the main motion that the Council not incur General Tax Revenue dollars to secure the land for the American West Heritage Center, but instead sell the land in North Logan, which the county owns, where the equestrian park is located and the revenue derived from that sale be used to secure the land next to the Heritage Center.

The motion died for lack of a second.

Lemon reminded Yeates the County is not using General Tax Revenue dollars to purchase the land and Lemon and several Council members expressed a reluctance to sell the North Logan property at this time.

Daines recommended having a written agreement with the American West Heritage Center regarding the County's options relative to the \$100,000.00.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Petersen to amend the main motion to approve the budget with the \$100,000.0 to the Heritage Center being granted contingent on the Heritage Center and Cache County being able to arrive at a mutually satisfactory resolution of what the uses will be of the land or, alternatively, if not satisfied with the uses, then the Heritage Center would have twelve months to repay the \$100,000.00. Zilles seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Zilles to fund the \$4,500.00 for the survey to be conducted by the Trust for Public Lands with the stipulation that any question related to funding for open space would be on the ballot for the 2008 general election. Hansen seconded the motion. The motion passed, 4 aye – Gibbons, Hansen, Robison & Zilles and 2 nay – Petersen & Yeates. Chambers absent.

ACTION: Chairman Gibbons called for the vote on the amended main motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

• Resolution No. 2007-17 – Authorizing Executive to Execute, Deliver a Master Lease Agreement, Equipment Schedule No. 01, an Escrow Agreement, and

Related Instruments and Determining Other Matters in Connection Therewith – Lemon explained that this is for the fire equipment.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Yeates to waive the rules and approve Resolution No. 2007-17-Authorizing Executive to Execute, Deliver a Master Lease Agreement, Equipment Schedule No. 01, an Escrow Agreement, and Related Instruments and Determining Other Matters in Connection Therewith. Robison seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0. Chambers absent.

• <u>Discussion - Water Management for Cache County</u> – Gibbons said Evan Olsen had presented recommendations to the Council last week. Gibbons, Zilles, Hansen and Lemon met this past week and reviewed the recommendations. Gibbons asked Zilles to present their findings and recommendations.

Zilles said the following are recommended:

- 1. Create a county water department and hire a department head with expertise in water, water law and water management, who reports to the County Executive for the first year.
- 2. Fund the water department with a dedicated tax of ¼ mil.
- 3. The Water Policy Advisory Board continues in its responsibilities.

Yeates asked how much ¼ mil will raise? Lemon estimated almost \$180,000.00 a year.

Robison asked if there would be any staff for the water department head?

Lemon said that Pat Parker would be the staff initially.

Petersen said the Regional Council adopted a resolution proposing that Franklin County be involved in any water issues in the valley.

ACTION: Motion by Council member Zilles to form a Cache County Water Department and hire a Water Department Head who will report to the County Executive for the first year; to fund the Water Department with a ¼ mil dedicated tax; to extend an invitation to Franklin County to provide a Franklin County Commissioner as a member of the Cache County Water Committee; and that the Water Policy Advisory Board remains intact. Hansen seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, 6-0.

- ✓ Hyrum City Library Dedication-May 26, 2007 at 2:00 p.m.
- ✓ Joint Meeting with Logan City Council May 29, 2007-5:00 p.m. Cache County Administration Building, Multi Purpose Room, Logan, Utah Gibbons said items for discussion will be the Willow Park agreement and the parking lot behind the businesses next to the County Administration Building.

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COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS

<u>Kathy Robison</u> said that Steven Branch, ICE, has agreed to a public forum in Cache County with information for a multicultural audience addressing issues such as how to become a legal citizen.

<u>Cory Yeates</u> reported on his WIR excursion to Alaska. Topics of interest were PILT payments, climate change and green space in zoning. Yeates also said there is a June 6, 2007 meeting with the Lieutenant Governor's office concerning the budget responsibilities for the November 2007 election.

<u>Craig Petersen</u> said the Regional Council has adopted a proposal to provide additional services to the Hispanic Community in the valley with regards to learning English and developing orientation materials in Spanish.

Chairman Gibbons reminded the Council of the County Sesquicentennial celebration on June 1, 2007.

A Resolution by the Cache County Council expressing its disapproval of the proposed "Voter Confidence and Increased Accessibility Act of 2007" (HR 811)

WHEREAS, the United States House of Representatives of the 110th Congress is considering a bill titled the "Voter Confidence and Increased Accessibility Act of 2007" (HR811); and

WHEREAS, the effect of the Bill, if adopted, would be to render the current DRE electronic voting machines used by Cache County, and other counties throughout the State of Utah unlawful, and require a change to a new voting system; and

WHEREAS, in an independent election survey of voters in the Utah 1st Congressional District general election using the DRE voting machines, conducted by the BYU "Center for the Study of Elections and Democracy", 95.3% of the respondents surveyed felt somewhat confident, or very confident that their ballot would be counted accurately; and

WHEREAS, Cache County currently has 396 DRE electronic voting machines valued at over one-and-a-half million dollars (\$1,500,000.00), and has invested several hundred thousand dollars in additional funds to warehouse said machines, revamp election processes to accommodate said machines, and train election personnel on the use of the machines; and

WHEREAS, change to a new voting system would actually erode voter confidence in the election process, and burden Cache County with additional expenses associated with a change to another new voting system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cache County Council does express its opposition to HR811, currently before the 110th Congress; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Cache County Council urges the 110th Congress, and in particular the Senators and Representatives serving the citizens of Cache County, and the State of Utah to reject HR811.



PROJECT

Request: The applicant is requesting a 5-lot subdivision to create two (2) building parcels in addition to the three existing parcels. The purpose of the subdivision is to create 4 building lots. The fifth lot will be designated as a dry lot. The lots are the following sizes, Lot 1 is 5.17 acres, Lot 2 is 5.11 acres, Lot 3 (existing) is 1.00 acre, Lot 4 (existing) is 1.12 acres, and Lot 5 is 66.20 acres. The proposed subdivision meets the minimum lot size requirements of §17.09.040 and the number of lots/ lot size requirements of §17.09.080 (there will be five lots from the original 1970 parent parcel).

Access: This subdivision is proposing to be serviced from 7200 West and 600 North, both county roads. County Road 7200 West has a 20 wide asphalt surface. County Road 600 North is an asphalt surface with a width of 18 feet. The Road Department recommends that stormwater issue be addressed as lots are developed.

Water & Septic: The applicant has been approved by the State of Utah Division of Water Rights for culinary water permits for this subdivision.

The Bear River Health Department has found that the soils on all of the lots are suitable for septic systems. Each home will be required to obtain a permit and install the septic in accordance with R317-4 Utah Administrative Code.

AGENCY AND COUNTY DEPARTMENT COMMENTS


Bear River Health Department:

- Site and soil conditions on Lots 1 and 2 are suitable for a septic system with a maximum trench depth of 24 inches. A septic permit will be required before installation.
- Due to the natural slope of the area, the septic systems should be placed on the east side of Lots 1 and 2.
- Lots 3 and 4 have existing septic systems.
- Lot 5 was not evaluated because it is designated a dry lot. If it is to be developed in the future a site evaluation, percolation test, and site fee will be required prior to obtaining a permit.
- A significant amount of area will be needed for septic placement because of high percolation rates on the lots.
- Any new septic system shall be between 100 and 200 feet from any water ways or wells, as determined by the Bear River Health Department.

Cache County Road Department:

- 7200 West, a County Road, has an existing paved surface width of 19 to 20 feet.
- 600 North, a County Road, has an existing paved surface of 18 feet. (This road will need to be widened to 20 feet to accommodate traffic.)
- Stormwater issues will need to be addressed as the lots are developed.

Dear Sirs:

Per reference A. above I expressed my concerns over my water supply. I feel that there are serious water issues that have not been resolved. I request that the subject subdivision not be approved and any building permits related to the Hilltop Farms Subdivision; which, as I understand it was approved previously, not be issued based on major issues that have not been resolved (also see below).

Per reference B. above it appears that there are pending revisions to the Agricultural Subdivisions Ordinance. I feel that the current ordinance was established primarily to preserve agriculture land and if any building was to be allowed - it was only to allow relatives of land owners to build on the land zoned as agriculture. I believe that there should not be any revisions to that policy. Based on my understanding of what 1 was told, there is a State law that further requires that new subdivisions on the same parcel as an existing home owner(s) needs approval by the existing home owner(s). I feel that any subdivision or building permits should be in harmony with the policy in order for them to be approved. I do not approve. In addition it seems contrary to the State law to allow more homes to be built on agriculture land unless they are for family members. Also as I understand it, it seems that if a conditional use permit was originally approved for a home owner that this State law does not apply. If rights are limited based on a conditional use permit; I do not feel that this is right, and ask that the council not approve the subdivision and ensure that building permits for agriculture land be issued to only family members accordingly. I do not think it should take minimal effort to rezone land simply to make development possible.

Please provide a written response to my written concerns to include detailed explanations of the supporting fact for my better understandings.

I was told by county representatives that there is a state law which gives me the right to prevent a subdivision and restrict conditional use permits from being issues on the same parcel that I own property on. I request that this right be enforced and the council take actions accordingly.

If the council is considering allowing the circumvention of the above, then I request that I be allocated a lot/use permit for use by a family member. I believe that building homes by "family" members to be a justified reason and in harmony with the county and state code and laws.

I believe that the impact and cost of the impacts of development are the responsibility of the development. There is no question that the quantity (and quality) of water (especially on this and surrounding parcels) is very limited. I believe that the cost of ensuring an adequate water supply should be bourn by the development. I again express my concerns over my water supply. I feel that there are serious water issues that have not been resolved. I request that subdivisions and related building permits not be approved unless these major issues are resolved before hand.

I have previously requested written responses to my prior written concerns to include detailed explanations of the supporting fact for my better understandings. I have not received any response to date and again request the same.

As I was told by legal council, public hearings are not a court of law. I think this is true but I also believe that the council should not allow lawyers to use known hearsay in there hearing.




AWHC PROPERTY ACQUISITION

Background

- 1. Parcel is 97.5 acres (About 45 acres is prime farmland and the rest is bottom land.)
- 2. AWHC has an option to buy at \$1.1 million which expires May 31, 2007 and that option will not be extended, nor can it be assigned to another party.
- 3. AWHC has several parties who have expressed interest in buying the property, but all would want to have some control over the use of the land.
- 4. Current market value of the property is at least \$1.5 million and may be considerably more. A formal appraisal has been commissioned and is nearly complete.
- 5. Ownership of the property would:
 - a. Give AWHC river access which provides opportunities for trails, handcart treks, and water recreation.
 - b. Prevent development, thus preserving open space and vistas surrounding AWHC.
 - c. Provide land for AWHC expansion.
 - d. Create opportunities for compatible recreational uses on the land by the County. The County owns recreational property in North Logan that could be traded as part of a comprehensive long-term plan.

Proposal

- 1. AWHC arranges for bank finance to purchase the entire parcel. Terms of the loan have been negotiated and a closing date set.
- 2. County assists by providing \$100,000 which will be used for closing costs on the loan and funds to match private donations.
- 3. AWHC will solicit donations:
 - a. AWHC will commit \$55,000 of its funds.
 - b. Two donors have agreed to donate \$100,000 <u>each</u> if the County commits \$100,000 as evidence of local support for the project.
 - c. AWHC will pursue additional contributions.
- 4. With County participation, \$340,000-\$355,000 will be immediately available to reduce the loan balance.
- 5. Immediately after purchase, County and AWHC begin discussions regarding mutually agreeable short and long term uses for the upper piece of land. These discussions might also include County representation on the AWHC Board.
